





FTM France

Then: Jean d'Arc was a brilliant young military genius and heroic general born Jehanne la Pucelle January 6, 1412 in the village of Domremy, in the Meuse River valley in the province of Lorraine in eastern France. He led seven successful military campaigns. When this deeply religious Christian patriot was captured by his enemies, he was offered the opportunity to live if he wore women's clothes, but he remained loyal to his beliefs. He was convicted of dressing as a man and burned at the stake in 1431. He was nineteen years old.

Then: Liberte was a decorated officer in Napoleon's army in seven campaigns 1792-9. He (1772-1859) first fought as a man, by the time his female anatomy was discovered he had proved so valuable in battle that he was allowed to remain in the military. He commanded male troops at Calvi who later drew up a testimonial which read in part, "We the garrison at Calvi certify that Marie-Angelique Josephine Duchemin Brulon, acting sergeant, commanding the attack on Fort Gesco, fought with us with the courage of a hero." They went on to commend his skill with a sword and in hand to hand combat. He was promoted to the rank of lieutenant in 1822 and personally presented the French Legion of Honor by Napoleon III.

George Sand

Then: George Sand, born Amantine-Aurore-Lucile Dupin in Paris 1804, was famous for dressing and behaving as male. He wrote eighty novels and twenty plays. In 1832 he published his first full-length novel, Indiana. It deplores gender inequality. He was friends with Honoré de Balzac, Frédérich Chopin and Gustave Flaubert. He died in 1876.

Then: Bonheur, the renown painter (1822-1899), had official permission from the French government to dress as a man in order to paint animals in the wild. Bonheur was the most popular artist of nineteenth-century France. Queen Victoria requested a private viewing of a Bonheur painting at Windsor Castle. It would later be purchased in 1887 by Cornelius Vanderbilt and donated to the new Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. In 1865 Bonheur received a visit from Empress

Eugénie who awarded the artist the Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor, the distinguished award established by Napoleon.

Then: Claude Cahun, born Lucy Renée Mathilde Schwob in a prominent French Jewish literary family in 1894 in Nantes, France, fought in the Resistance against the Nazis. He studied at Oxford (1907-1908) and the Sorbonne (1914). He produced self-portraits from 1912 until 1954, many bending gender, wrote about Oscar Wilde and translated Havelock Ellis into French. The Gestapo raided his home in 1944 and he was sentenced to death but in February 1945 he was rescued by Allied forces. He lived on the Isle of Jersey until his death in 1954.



Armand Hotimsky is a therapist and President of the Center for Assistance, Research and Information on Trans and Gender Identity. He held the first meetings in Paris in 1991 and founded CARITIG in 1995 for information, networking, meetings, publications, a newsletter, hotline and participation in Pride marches.



MA MFT LIC # MFC32646 Then: James Gray, born Hannah Snell in 1722 in Worcester, moved to London then enlisted the army in 1745. Later James joined the marines and served bravely in India against the French at Pondi-

cherry. He was injured but managed to conceal his female anatomy. In June 1750, he published The Female

Soldier; or The Surprising Life and Adventures of Hannah Snell. He became the toast of London - his story was a best seller and his portrait was sold on every street corner. In November 1750, the Royal Chelsea Hospital officially recognized his military service and granted him a lifetime pension. By the end of 1750, word of this twenty-seven-year-old's adventures had spread across the whole of Britain. He continued to dress as a man, took up acting in "breeches" (male) roles in the theatre and opened a pub. He died in 1792.

Then: Dr. James Barry was born Miranda Stuart in 1799. The future Inspector-General of the British Army Medical Corps began to live as a young man at age ten in 1809 when he entered medical school at Edinburgh University, qualifying with a Medical Doctorate in 1812. James became a doctor in the British army in 1813. He performed the first successful Caesarean section where both mother

and child survived. He worked as a medical inspector in South Africa and as a medical officer in Jamaica, Saint Helena, Barbados, Antigua, Malta, Corfu, the Crimea, and Montreal. He records in a memorandum that he had received "the thanks of the Duke of Wellington for my services." In Canada he was promoted to the rank of Inspector-General, with rank equivalent to major-general, in 1858. He died in London, where he had been born, on 26 July 1865.

John M. Radclyffe (1880 - 1943)Hall wrote the first novel transgender about men, called "inverts," and referred to himself

as an "invert." The character in the novel The Well of Loneliness, Stephen Gordon, used a male name for himself and described his body in the book as transgender. The book became a classic. Born Marguerite Radclyffe Hall August 12th 1880 in Bournemouth, Dorset, he was known as Peter as a child but later called himself John. He was educated at King's College, Lon-



don, and then in Germany. He published five volumes of poetry and four novels, three of them highly successful. Hall published The Well of Loneliness in 1928, it sold over 10,000 copies in its first year. Over the years, he received more than 10,000 letters about the novel. He died in London on October 7, 1943.






Peter Gluck (1895-1978) was born as Hannah Glukstein to a wealthy and close-knit Jewish family on August 13, 1895. He demanded to be referred to only as Gluck and always wore men's clothing. Brooks' famous portrait of Gluck, Peter, was executed between 1923 and 1924. During 1925, Gluck painted a self-portrait in which he depicted himself wearing a shirt, tie, suspenders, and beret. The same year Brooks' portrait of Gluck dressed in male attire was shown in solo exhibitions in Paris, London, and New York.

Gluck died at the age of eighty-two on January 10, 1978.

Baron Dr. Ewan Forbes-Semphil MD, was born Elizabeth Forbes-Semphill as an intergendered person with an ovatestes in 1912 in Scotland. From an early age he preferred masculine attire and manner. In the 1930's he became deeply involved in the Scottish country dance revival movement, dressing and dancing the man's part. He graduated from the University of Aberdeen in 1944. He became a physician and surgeon until 1955 when he retired to his family estates to focus on farming. During his practice as a physician he presented as a man. He changed his name and gender on his birth certificate to male in August 1952 and married two months later. He won a lawsuit that his cousin brought against him in 1966 challenging his inheritance as Baron when the judge ruled that he was intergender predominantly male. Dr. Ewan Forbes-Semphill was known to have prescribed male hormones for himself.



Dr. Michael Laurence Dillon MD transitioned in 1949 three years before the famous Christine Jorgensen case in 1952. Michael was born as Laura Maud Dillon in 1915 to an aristocratic English family. Michael preferred masculine clothing and activities and when he reached adolescence he bound his chest with a belt. Educated at St Anne's College. Oxford, Dillon won his rowing blue in a women's crew and graduated in 1938. During college at Oxford he started to dress socially as a man and go to men-only events. Facial hair and a deep voice confirmed his feelings of being a man, and he took

a job as a garage hand for four years. After graduating from Oxford he began taking testosterone. He had chest surgery in 1942. In 1944, at age 29, he officially had his birth certificate changed to read Michael Laurence Dillon, male. He also contacted Sir Harold Gillies and had phalloplasty surgery. Michael entered medical school in Trinity College Dublin in 1945 under his new name. He won his rowing blue, this time as a man, graduated in 1951, and became a ship's doctor, serving on voyages to Asia, Australia, and America. Michael became a Tibetan Buddhist monk at the monastery at Sarnath, Bengal, writing books under his ordained name, Lobzang Jivaka. Two books by him were published in London in 1962: *The Life of Milarepa* and *Imji Getsul*. He died at age 47 in 1962 in Punjab.



Raymond Thompson, a member of UK FTM Network, wrote What Took You So Long: A Girl's Journey to Manhood. (1995)

Mark Rees wrote *Dear Sir or Madam*. (1995) Mark was the first in the UK to go to the European Court of Human Rights, also he is one of the founders of Press For Change in 1992 and a leading figure in the FTM network. Mark was born Brenda in

1942. After transition in 1971 Mark could not be ordained in the Church of England because legally he was female. This prompted Mark to begin his determined fight for legal recognition in 1972. From 1989 until 2001 Mark traveled the UK speaking at conferences. Mark was elected by his village to serve as a on the Tunbridge Wells Borough Council from 1994-98.

Paul Hewitt

Paul Hewitt is a member of UK FTM Network. Like most twins, Martine and Karen Hewitt were very close. Born in 1967, they grew up in Reading, a town just outside London. But Martine decided she was not a woman but a man trapped inside a woman's body. Now a technical author, he has told his story in a book, *A Self-Made Man.* (*Hammond, H. Paul Hewitt. Cosmo, 1995.*)



Dr. Jay Prosser PhD earned his BA in London and his MA and PhD at City University of New York. He is a professor at Leichester and author of *Second Skins* (1998); *Light in the Dark Room* (2004); and *Palatable Poison* (2002).

James Robbins Peace Officer in South Yorkshire, is now living as a man and plans to undergo surgery later this year. In a state-

ment South Yorkshire Police said: "Police are giving him their full support and are doing as much as they can to help him adapt to the change." (2002) UK.

FTM Canada



David Reimer, the Canadian man raised as a girl for the first 14 years of his life, died at 38 in his hometown of Winnipeg, Canada. Reimer's story told in the 2000 book As Nature Made Him by John Colapinto. He was born Aug. 22, 1965, 12 minutes before his identical twin brother. His workingclass parents named him Bruce and his brother Brian. Bruce was maimed in a circumcision accident at 8 months old. Shortly second before his birthday. Bruce became Brenda on an operating table at Johns Hopkins on the advice of infamous Dr. John Money. In an article published in the Archives of Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine in 1997, Dr. Milton Diamond at the University of Hawaii and psychiatrist, Dr. H. Keith Sigmundson showed how Brenda had steadily rejected reassignment. She transitioned and changed her name to David, identifying with

the Biblical David who fought Goliath. When he was 25, he married adopted and three children. David is survived by his wife, Jane: mother, Janet Reimer and her husband, Ron., and his children. "I was never happy as Brenda," he told the PBS Nova series. "Never. From what I've been taught by my father, what makes you a man is you treat your wife well, you put a roof your family's over head, you're a good father. That to me is a

man."

Rupert Raj-Gautier MA, began living full time as a man in Ottawa in 1971 and the following year, at the age of 20 he was surgically reassigned to a male. He founded three organizations and three periodicals.

Stephen Whittle PhD, is Senior Lecturer at the School of Law at Manchester Metropolitan University, Coordinator of the UK FTM Network, Vice-President of Press for Change and author of *The Margins of the City* 1994, *The Trans and the Law* 1995, *Reclaiming Genders* 1999, *The Transgender Debate* 2000 and *The White Book*. He was born May 29, 1955 and transitioned in 1975 and is mar-

ried with four children. He earned his BA at Sussex University and chose as the subject for his PhD thesis, Trans and the Law. Stephen Whittle felt he was a boy from the age of about three. He began hormones at 18 and at 19 he had a hysterectomy and mastectomy and more recently phalloplasty. In 1990 he founded the FTM Network with over 700 members in the UK and members from another 20 countries. He recognized that getting inside and using the law was the only way forward after seeing the publicity surrounding Mark Rees's application to the European Court of Human Rights. He organised and co-ordinated the III International Congress on Sex and Gender which was held at Exeter College, Oxford University. The Congress was attended by over 170 academics, medical practitioners and community leaders working in the field of transgender studies. Stephen is editor of "Boy's Own," newsletter and active in Press For Change. He is a practicing attornev. He served on the Board of Directors of FTM International.



Dr Richard Curtis, age 38, is the first to be recognized by the GMC under terms laid out by the Gender Recognition Act, which came into force in April. Dr Curtis trained at St Bart's and the Royal London School of Medicine. He was born Vanda Zadorozny, a miner's daughter from Pontefract, West Yorkshire. He underwent two years of "genderspecific" counseling, hormone treatment and a hysterectomy and mastectomy. Dr Curtis paid for his own medical treatment. Dr Curtis told his 80-year-old father, a Polish immigrant

who came to England after the Second World War, about his surgery. He said that after having been in a forced labor camp under the Nazis when he was 16, nothing could really get to him. Dr Curtis also told his younger twin brothers, who are 37 and live in Russia and Sweden. Both have been supportive. Dr Richard Curtis is purchasing the premises at Earls Court of Dr. Russell Reid in London. See his website at www.transhealth.co.uk He qualified as a doctor in 1991. He currently works as a genitourinary medicine physician and GP for the NHS. He is known at the FTM London group. He is also a member of the FTM network and GENDYS. He has been approached to be on the government working party for transgender issues in the provision of healthcare. He is in the process of writing for medical journals and will be proactive in educating healthcare professionals about this field. (*Day, E. First trans GP. The Telegraph UK*, 9 October 2005)



Eric Haywood-Farmer MD At the end of her second year of medical school at the University of Ottawa, Christy Haywood-Farmer went home for the summer--and she never came back. In her place was a young man named Eric, who came to Ottawa from his family home on a cattle ranch outside Kamloops, B.C. In April 2004, using \$4,500 of his student loan money, he underwent chest reconstruction. Haywood-Farmer is dedicated to improving health care for the transgendered. Though he's 26 and taking testosterone, he has yet to sprout facial hair. "I get called Doogie Howser at least five times a day." The last two years have been made easier by Haywood-Farmer's partner, an Ottawa lawyer. (Ennis, H. Change is Good. The Medical Post, Volume 41 Issue 01 - January 4, 2005.)



Dr. Aaron H. Devor PhD. is a member of International. ISNA and HBIGDA. He is Professor of Sociology and Dean at the University of Victoria, Canada. he earned his PhD in Sociology from the Washington, his MA in Communications from Simon Fraser University and his BA in Psychology from York University. His first book was Gender Blending: Confronting the Limits of Duality. His

second book, *FTM: Female-to-Male Transsexuals in Society*, provides detailed life experiences of 45 FTMs. He was one of only 10 recipients in Canada of a 3M fellowship in 2000 that recognizes excellence in teaching. He received the 1995 University of Victoria Alumni Teaching Award. Meryn Cadell is a Canadian singer and writer. He teaches the writing of song lyrics and libretto in the Creative Writing Program at University of British Columbia. A graduate of the Ontario College of

He signed to Intrepid Records and released the 1991 album Angel Food For Thought, whose first single "The Sweater" became a Top 40 hit in Canada in 1992. In 1993 Cadell released Bombazine on Sire Records. In 1997 Cadell released 6 Blocks on Handsome Boy Records. On October 2, 2004, Cadell came out as FTM on broadcaster Bill Richardson's CBC Radio One show Bunny Watson.

mission from Pope Urban VIII to dress as a man. He was placed in a convent as a child and deserted the convent dressed in men's clothing made from his nun's habit as a teenager. He sailed from Spain to Latin America as Francisco de Loyola, enlisted in the army and served in Mexico, Panama, Peru and Chile and rose to the rank of ensign. He returned to Spain, where he continued to wear male attire and had a reputation as la Monja Alférez, "the Lieutenant Nun," a dual image that fascinated the public after he wrote his autobiography in 1624. In a 1625 petition to King Felipe IV of Spain for a yearly stipend, he referred to his fifteen years as a soldier under the name Alonso Díaz Ramírez de Guzmán. The petition was granted. He returned to Mexico as Antonio de Erauso and worked as a mule-driver and merchant. He died as a soldier in South America in 1645.

Then: Harry T. Buford, Latino Civil War Officer, born Loreta Janeta Velazquez in 1842, fought for the South. He wrote a book published in 1876. (The Woman in Battle: A Narrative of the Exploits, Adventures and Travels of Madame Loreta Janeta Velazquez, Otherwise Known as Lieutenant Harry T. Buford, Confederate States Army. Richmond, Va: Dustin, Gilman Co., 1876).


