anging out and having coffee with the gorgeous dancers/models/actresses Candis Cayne and Girlina is a trip, not only because of the wonderful friendship that lies much deeper than the makeup, hair and legs, but because they are refreshingly witty, downto-earth, and genuine.

We all met at Venus, the trendy SoHo clothing store where Candis works in hair and makeup. I arrived a little early and while we waited for "Lina," as Candis affectionately refers to Girlina, we scanned some photographs of Candis from a recent photo shoot, and started talking about her rise to the top of the New York City club world.

Ivan: So how did you get your start?

Candis: I started out performing at a place called Boy Bar and I'd always been in theater and dancing. I'm a trained dancer. I started out there and I

started getting money for it.

Ivan: And when did you start doing drag?

Candis: Well, I'm not a drag queen, I'm transsexual. But, I'm a performer. I don't like to label it at all. I'm just a performer and an actress, model. I like to entertain and that's my favorite thing to do, be on stage in front of

Ivan: Are you a native New Yorker? Candis: No, originally I'm from Maui. Ivan: Really? That's a long way. Candis: Yeah, it is. I'm a Hawaiian girl. Ivan: How many years have you been in New York? Candis: Four and a half.

Ivan: So you've pretty much risea to the top quickly.

Candis: (shyly) Yeah, I guess. I just worked really hard and I think it's something you have inside. And if you're good at what you do, people notice that. And you should never have a big head or an ego, or be bitchy and mean, and I think that's what's gotten me here today. I've always been nice and am the same girl who moved here four years ago.

Ivan: How did you meet Girlina?

Candis: I met her actually when Mona Foot did Star Search at Crowber and we competed against each other four years ago. I had never performed before. That was actually the first or second time I performed and we kept bumping into each other after that and ended up living near each other, so we started hanging out. We're really close.

Ivan: You just appeared in the HBO movie Dragtime. How was th Candis: It's good. It was really fun. I enjoyed doing it and I enjoyed

Candis: Not everybody, not everybody that should be, but a lot of people. Ivan: Who do you think should have been that want? Candis: Sherry Vine, Mistress Formika, Mona, Girlins should have been in

it more. She was only in that one scene.

Ivan: Does everyone get along? Candis: Yeah, of "the girls," we all get along. We come from that school that we're all friends and try to help each other instead of hinder each other. We're not from the old school of girls who were really catty and had to have a big attitude to survive. Ivan: Where are you performing these days?

Candis: I perform on Mondays at Barracuda, and

then wherever I get a gig.

Ivan: You've cut back a lot. There was a time when you were working almost every night. Candis: I just kind of cut those out. I don't

want to hostess anymore, I'd rather perform. So if I'm going to go to a club, I want to go in there, relax, think about what I'm gonna do, perform and then leave, because I'm not good at staying out until 4:00 in the moming. I'd rather be at home, getting my beauty sleep, waking up early

and doing things. Ivan: Who are your influences? Candis: Cyd Charisse

and Ann Margaret.

A short while later, the leggy and gorgeous Grifina joined us at Venus. After hello kisses and a quick giance at Candis' pictures, the three of us were off to Scharmann's, a coffee bar just steps away from Venus.

Ivan: Candis and I already caught up on her background, so tell me a little

Girlina: Let's see. Well, I was born and raised here in New York. I danced professionally for ten years, jazz, tap, ballet and modern. After high school went to Europe, came back and I was kind of over the States, so I move to Montreal for a year and a half, then I moved back to New York. That's when the whole entertaining thing came about. I came here and everything happened so fast. I was always business oriented as far as what I wanted to

Remember the African people with you and Slasta? Candis was my long-lost guiffriend who my guiffriend Shasta had as a maid. I remember it, I remember it. But there's no one like my sister Candis. People are like, "How long did it take you guy sto choreograph that?" We man things out in our head, we go into the studio, we lay down the music and the tracks, and because we're both missed dancers, the energy between us like nothing. Ivan: Is that how you really hooked up, because you were both trained.

Candis: Well, not even that, but we're both entertainers. If we're together on a runway, we don't think about turning together, we just do. Griina: Exactly. Good analogy, girl. I hope that answers your question, it

Ivan: Ethnically, what are you? People always wonder about that. Candis: I'm Italian and Irish.

Girlina: My father's white Irish and my Mom is black. Ivan: Who are your biggest influences?

Girlina: My Mom. She's such a strong woman. I'm an only child and she mised me. My mother actually hosted Milk for me while I was away. My mother is so funky. Candis' mother is fierce too.

Cardis: She says hello, by the way.

Girlina: Oh, love her. Give Trisha some sugar. My influences have definitely been Mona, love Mona. Needless to say, I don't even have to elaborate on my sister, and Bunny of course. Both of them I've looked up to for such a long time, even before I started performing. I've always loved their work. I've loved what they've done for themselves and for the communiwas. I we note wast usey we once for themselves and for me community. They're not just girls entertaining, they have a message and I think it's definitely not about being a faceless person. We as entertainers have so much power that is given to us. The girls who give back are the girls who pave the way for new girls who are really serious about being entertainers. Ivan: You were in Paper last month.

Girlina: Yeah, and Candis is in Surface this month. Amezin Candis: Dalin's pictures...

Girlina: Oh my God, amazing. The Guess ads. He has to shoot us, girl. (Into the tape recorder) Dalin, Dalin, can you hear us, Cand and Leea, we need you to shoot us

Canids: He's a friend of ours. The waiter agrees, so we should be shot by

Ivan: Every time something is written about you, Jada Pinkett is always

Girlina: Oh, Jada, Love Jada. She is the bomb. That woman is so strong. and so fierce. I remember watching her on A Different World, and I was like, "work, girl." Jada was so much fun to work with. Before we started shooting, we got to hang out a little, because in the movie I play her best friend. So, I told her about my best friend Candis, and she told me about her best friend, and we got that connection, so when we were shooting, it was real. And John Singleton, he loved my work and that made me feel good because if s not everyday I work with a big director.

Ivan: Go ahead, plug the movie, girl. What's it called?

Girlina: That's Woo, John Singleton's new movie on New Line. It comes

out this spring. And then me and Candis have a movie coming out this summer, possibly on Miramax called Always Something Better.

Candis: Would you excuse me for a moment?

Girlina: (commenting on Candis' jeans) Jordache, work! I finally got her to get a pair. I have tons from when I was in high school. I did a Jordache commercial when I was a kid.

Ivan: I was telling Candis earlier that in Mariah Carey's video for The Roof, she's wearing designer jeans and this whole 80s look.

Girlina: She mopped me! I was at Tunnel one night when me, Candis, Sherry Vine and Jackie Beat were doing Tunnel. I had either my Jordache or Sergio's on and that's just my look, with the feathered hair. I love feathered hair.
