Cross-Port Basics

Well, the new year is upon us and as we look ahead we hope that each of you will be able to grow in your feminine self as much as Cross-Port has grown in the last year.

Kevin Palmer will be attending the January Meeting to discuss make-up. Kevin teaches classes in make-up, besides his work at "The Hair Works" and has done make-up for many of the Female Impersonators in our area and other IV's and TS's. He suggest you bring your own make-up with you. We will be starting this part of the meeting at 8: 00 PM and break for business about 9: 30

The December meeting drew 25 people tying our record for attendance. Linda's idea to bring a snack to share and make the meeting a Christmas Party went over well. We had plenty to eat and everyone had a good time. Silver, was our new face this month and we welcomed back Andrea from way up north. I thank everyone who has been able to attend at least one meeting this past year and a special thanks to those who come every month and those who drive long distances. We do need and appreciate your support.

Items discussed during the business meeting were many and focused on the possible future needs of Cross-Port. The first item concerned my personal telephone. I enjoy recieving calls and talking to all of you. In fact, I encourage you to call, however, it is reaching the point where some nights I recieve so many calls that my wife can not use the phone. I requested that those persent consider authorizing the installation of a second phone at my home which would be used only for Cross-Port. I have checked the cost which would run about \$24/month plus about \$90 installation. The topic will be discussed again this month.

The second item concerned a way to pay for the first. As many of you know I have consistantly opposed the idea of dues or a meeting fee. I believe that it should not cost anyone an arm and a leg to receive support, just because they are TV's or TS's. I also believe however, that Cross-Port should not be a support group only for those who come to meetings. In the last year most of the support for the group has come from those who attend the meetings and some months the collections just got us by. We currently send out over 106 news-letters. About 46 of those go to other groups, professionals and support people. That leaves about 60 people who receive the "InnerView". I am proposing a dues of

\$1. 50/month (\$18/year) and a meeting fee of \$3/meeting. That is a total of \$4. 50/month for those who come to the meetings. This is \$. 50 cheaper than most groups charge just for meeting fees. Annual dues would be due on January 1. Those joining after that would be charged by the number of months remaining. See Proposed Budget later in this issue.

The third item concerned the idea of changing part of the screening process. In the past several months more and more of the people contacting me are from out of town. They want to come to a meeting but finding a time to meet with them prior to the meeting proves difficult. I proposed that I be authorized to invite the person to a meeting as their screening. They would be told that they may attend one meeting and then I will contact them about future meeting. It should be pointed out that the reason for the screening is not so much to say we don't want some one but rather to determine whether this kind of group is what they are looking for in a support group. To this end many times my talking to them by phone is sufficient to determine this, however, many times they must make the final decission after they attend a meeting. Some have chosen not to come back. Those present decided that this policy would be changed.

The next Wife/Girlfriend support meeting will be held on a Monday night. January 26, because of some schedule confilcts. Those planning to attend don't forget to call if the weather is bad to see if it is still on.

Those present approved the continuation of our ad in the "Downtowner" and the joining of 6C6/LC. Checks for both were sent.

The business ended about 10: 45 and the party continued.
