For those of you who don't know me I am Susan [REDACTED], a post-op Transsexual woman, acting as an advisor to TGIC for TS affairs. In the capacity as advisor I have attended several rap groups and offer the following conclusions.

- 1) Many people who think they are TS move quickly and circumvent the mechanism that allows you to change your mind.
- 2) Many think that a sex change will correct all their problems.

In addressing this, I would like to say that moving too fast is probably one of the worst things a person could do. The mechanism places hurdles on your route intentionally, and these are there to give you every opportunity to change your mind and are deliberately tough to test your resolve. I know how hard it is to do it right and am glad I did not short cut the process. You can't go back (at least easily) and it makes for a very difficult problem afterwards.

If you move too quickly by just going for one session to a psychiatrist, end up on hormones (and this is where #2 comes in) and think everything will be OK afterward, you're wrong! Abusive parents, substance abuse, compulsive gambling, depression, and all other maladies are still there, and many is the person who committed suicide after realizing this.

We could carry this on indefinitely but just be sure. Follow accepted guidelines to bring you through a successful surgery. There is no shame in getting part way, deciding reassignment isn't right for you, stopping and going back. To go on if uncertain and possibly destroy your life is wasteful. SRS isn't a game to see if you can answer the therapists questions the right way.

Recently, I spoke to both Senator Kennedy and Congressman Hawkin's offices in Washington, D.C.. Both have agreed to sponsor Senate and House versions of the Civil Rights Act of 1990. Apparently nothing is in writing yet, as far as the content of the Act is concerned. The thrust will be to reenact protections invalidated by Reagan appointed jurists. Seldom does one get a second chance.

The past six months have been frustrating as only a few have been willing to write letters or donate funds to lobby against Senate amendment 722 to Senate Bill S.933 or section 511 to House Bill H.R. 2273, which not only invalidate some hard won judicial victories for the transsexual community, but place transsexuals in the same category as pedophiles, kleptomaniacs, pyromaniacs, exhibitionist and voyeurs, under color of law. We have an opportunity to speak out and overturn the erroneous decisions of the Voyles, Holloway, Read, Kirkpatrick and Ulane courts, which excluded transsexuals from protection under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

I have prepared a 20 page monograph on gender dysphoria (what it is, what it is not) and civil rights decisions. J2CP is beginning to send it to Senators and Congressman serving its district/state. Your help is needed. Please take the time to write your own Senator, Congressman, and the President, supporting the Civil Rights Act of 1990 and asking that transsexuals be included within the meaning of the word "sex". (Copies may be obtained by contacting Jennifer or J2CP if want to send them to your own representatives.) One is going to the president, which should be sufficient for his office.

MARCH ON ALBANY - Jennifer [REDACTED]

"Making or rights a reality" is the theme of a mass demonstration being sponsored by the NYS Lesbian and Gay Lobby on Sunday April 29th. In an effort to positively influence legislation on Bias-Related Violence legislation, a Gay and lesbian civil rights bill, protection similar to that afforded married couples for "domestic partnerships", increased AIDS funding, bills banning discrimination to PWA or perceived to be HIV +, passage of a health care proxy bill, and equal access to care and insurance, Sunday will be the climax of five days of seminars demonstrations and entertainment.

Since many folks in the gender community are affected by many of these same issues, some are themselves gay or have gay friends, and in view of the support and understanding the gender community has recieved from the gay community, and in view of the recognized need for cross community networking with other similarly affected groups like single mothers, elderly, womens causes, and other minorities, TGIC is proud to announce that we will be participating to head a gender contingent for this March on Albany. In the first political action for our community in NY, we hope we can draw gender people from across the state to join us under a banner proclaiming "THE GENDER COMMUNITY SUPPORTS RIGHTS LEGISLATION".

The Reverend Niemoller was imprisoned by the Nazis, during WW II, in one of their death camps. He died in 1980.

I think the above passage is appropriate, because if we don't speak up for our rights, no one can be expected to do it for us. If we allow our rights to be abrogated and taken away, then we have no one to blame but ourselves!





A nightmare for some transvestites is being discovered in a woman's restroom. So imagine what it would be like to be discovered in a woman's PRISON? That's what happened recently to Carlos Torrez. But this feat of impersonation wasn't accomplished because Torrez was so beautiful, it was because police in Schenectady, N.Y. mistook him for a short, overweight "ugly girl".

Torrez was arrested on disorderly conduct and criminal impersonation charges. He was reportedly uncooperative while he was being held in custody. The fact that he is mute didn't help either. Before his arraignment he provided officers with a note saying his name was "Dianna Torres". Not being able to post bond, "she" was then ordered to the women's section of the county jail, strip searched and assigned to a cell. There, she wrote another note saying that she was in the wrong section. A Nurse conducted a second search and confirmed his claim.



TELLING MY KIDS - Marsha

If you talk with enough crossdressers you soon realize that the stories may be the same but each has a different ending. Most of them have happy endings but there are a few tragic endings. I had always thought that when I told my two girls it would not be a happy one, but life sure plays tricks on us.

The idea of someday telling our two girls has always been a problem for me. My wife has known for years and has come to understand and to be extremely supportive of my crossdressing. My relationship with our two girls has never been a normal father - daughter one, to say it has been strained would be about right. So this was always on my mind whenever the idea of telling them came up. The girls are 16 and 13 years old, along with the fact that they knew something, made the time now.

They had been dropping little hints about me or my manhood for sometime, but I still did not want to face telling them. Once they let it out that they had found some stuff, I made up my mind fast. My wife agreed with me, and when the time came, I asked my her to prepare them for me before I got home from work that night. She offered to be the one to tell them but I did not want it to look as if I could not do it myself. So, with the stage set, (or at least I thought so) I would tell them that night. All that day at work I was going over what I would say to them. When I got home, however, my wife said that she had not had the time to talk with them. My heart sank, but I couldn't give up now, if I did it would be a long time, I felt, before I could do it again.

The girls and I went to the store. On the way we joked around a lot but on the way home I got serious with them. I only went into a little detail with them. I told them it has been going on for almost my whole life, that mom knew and was very supportive, and above all

that this was to be a family secret. Noone was to be told. All the time I was talking, they just sat there, not a word out of them. When I said the word crossdresser no one said anything so I asked if they knew what I meant. The oldest one said "Sure, its the same as a TV". From there they went in and up to their rooms without saying a word to their mother.

When I came in I told my wife that I did it. She was surprised, happy, and started to cry. She went up to see the girls later that night. She re-enforced them about not telling anyone and asked if they had any questions. There were none. So before she left she explained how society lets females wear male clothes but can not take males wearing femaleclothes.

The following Saturday was the Public meeting for TGIC. I was the only one home while I was getting ready. As I left I put a letter to each of them on the kitchen table. In the letters I told them a little more about myself. I told them I was not gay or that I did not have any plans on changing my sex. Just that I enjoy dressing as a woman from time to time. I also said that I was still their father and that I still love them very much. Most important, I said that I would not push any information on crossdressing on them. I would wait until they asked questions of either me or their mother. It would be at their pace not mine. It has been a little longer than a week since I told them.

If anything has changed it is that they are more social to me. We still talk, joke around, and they have not been trying to avoid me at all. It was not at all like I had thought it would be. I pictured that they would hate me and shut me out, but its not at all like that. I realize that I have taken a big burden off of my back and put it on their back, but as a family we can handle it. I have a supportive wife and now my kids know, as I said life can sure play tricks.

I realize that everyone has to do what they feel is best for them, I just hope that my telling this story might help someone else. If I can be of help to anyone just let me know. Dawn can get ahold of me.
