I didn't realize at that time that we as transgendered people (or however you want to describe yourself) have been given a gift from whomever or whatever you believe in. No... I was too busy trying to hide my dirty little secret, and feeling less than human because of it. As a result I had no friends except my spouse, distant family, lack of community, devoid of spirit.



grips with myself allowed me to start accepting the world into my circle. Getting rid of the self-loathing gave me permission to love others. I will always be grateful to Tri-Ess for providing that first contact.

After the first tippy-toe steps into the gender pond, I quickly found myself splashing around like some crazed mallard duck. At first all the other ducks came out to play, then the geese and swans and great blue herons and on and on. You get the picture. It's rather chaotic, but, oh, what fun! How can one go back to being a solitary mallard duck, or just allow other mallard ducks into my circle, after that kind of excitement!

You've taken the first step out of your solitary closet. Throw wide the doors, accept yourself, love yourself. You're not just OK, you're a unique gifted person!

So it is with considerably mixed emotions that I sit here writing my last official column. Over the past couple of years, I have tried to give back something to Chi by bringing you interesting and entertaining programs. "Something for everybody" has been my motto. For the most part, I have been pleased that this has worked out well. That is why I find it so puzzling when a highly respected senior member of Chi Chapter was overheard remarking that she will be glad to "get back to regular programming."


