

And what a way to welcome the beginning of Spring — March 20th! The weather and flowers and simply gorgeous along the lower Mississippi at that time of the year. After lunch, take the bus down Canal Street to the Rivergate Convention Center, a great place for photos with the building and river scenes as background. From there,

it's a short walk to the Canal St Ferry for a free roundtrip crossing of the Mississippi and another excellent opportunity for scenic views and phots of yourself in action en femme.

Meanwhile, back at the hotel, our Night People are beginning to stir and getting ready to meet us in the Hospitality Suite for the afternoon grooming session featuring tips on hair style selection and wig maintenance. After that, there's time for socializing, meeting and getting to know your sisters from all over the country, establishing new friendships and renewing old acquaintances. Some of the girls may be having their first public outing and we'll enjoy sharing this exceptionally exciting experience with them. These private "get-together" times are highly valued and memorable occasions.

Now it's time to get a little rest, to freshen your face, and dress for the evening dinner at that fun-tastic restaurant called "Anything Goes." Here, every table and booth has a different theme — from an Indian teepee to a jail cell, or maybe you'll be in the igloo or the giant bearcan. The waiters and waitresses are costumed as a cast of characters — you may be served by Tarzan or Cleoptra, or maybe even Bugs

Bunny or Groucho Marx. If a mere crossdresser attracts attention in here, it will be surprising.

If you can stand any more fun in one day, then let's swish over to the Gunga Din Club and have a few drinks while watching the female impersonator show.

By now, your feet will probably insist that you take a ride through the moonlight in one of those enchanting open, horse-drawn carriages to get back to the hotel. There, intrigued by the Naughty Nightie room party, you will somehow find the energy to go on for a couple of hours more, socializing with your sisters — till at last the Sandman calls you to lay your pretty head down for some much needed sleep.

And, you'd better rest, for in the days ahead, there's the horseraces, the Wax Museum, more shopping, cocktails and the fabulous nighttime view from the Top Of The Mart, the Superdome tour, the perfume shop, Crazy Shirley's Club (for that famous Dixieland Music), the Creole seafood dinner (if it lives in the water, they know how to cook it in New Orleans), a ride on the St. Charles Streetcar through the garden district to Audubon Park & Zoo, shopping at the French Market, the City Tour by bus, and that outrageous costume room party that's "Too Late For Mardi Gras." Now, it's not that all these things you do and places you go are super attractions, per se — the thing that makes it all so special is doing it as a girl!! Every action you take (even things as simple as boarding a bus or buying an admission ticket), involves interaction with other people — the public, and, as well as being exciting, builds your confidence that your girlself can really do these things

and handle all situations you may encounter.

As a girl, have you ever purchased a ticket to a theatre, ordered a dinner, hailed a taxi, or tried to step up on a bus in a tight skirt while wearing four inch heels? As a girl, have you ever asked a policeman for directions, or tried to hold your hair and your skirt down at the same time while carrying your purse and packages on a windy street, and have you ever bought your shoes while dressed and been able to actually try them on in the store - and not have to give silly excuses for buying them? Well, these things, and much more, are what you can experience at Holiday En Femme. That's what it's all about - the experience and fun of actually living as a girl for four wonderful days.

Perhaps you can do these things in your home area, if you're daring enough, but in New you're anonymous and can move about freely because the people are simply not concerned. The city, through 250 years of assimilating groups of many backgrounds and lifestyles, has developed a sophisticated tolerance of differences. So just relax and enjoy your self.

By restricting attendance at Holiday En Femme to Tri-Ess national members, we are more assured of having a congenial group of like-minded sisters. And, there will be less possibility of giving an inaccurate impression of our objectives and interests to the public and the businesspeople with whom we will be dealing. We want good relations with these people so that they will welcome us the next time we are here.

Participation in the Holiday En Femme is one of the major benefits of being a member of Tri-Ess, along with the Directory (now at the printers) and mail forwarding service, the Femme Mirror, Chapter activities and the Tri-Ess Clarion which accompanies this publicity release about our Holiday En Femme.

Without our national organization, these benefits would not be possible, and National couldn't exist without the support of members through dues and the un selfish contribution of untold hours by Carol and other members of the sororoty.

Perhaps the opportunity to attend the Holiday En Femme will persuade some prospective member to sign up now, and, hopefully, we'll see some former members back in the fold. We would really love to have you, so come on, join us in this marvelous enjoyment of our sisterhood.

Rooms and suites have been reserved at two of the French Quarter's nicest hotels: the Provincial and The Chateau, which are across the street from each other in the 1000 block of Rue Chartres, just two blocks from Jackson Square, the heart of the Quarter.

Why two hotels? For these reasons: 1. Ambience — we wanted the tranquil beauty and Old World charm of the smaller hotels with their lovely garden patios, period furnishings and the authentic flavor of the Vieux Carre. 2. These small hotels (even those with 100 rooms) would not accept group reservations. The rooms had to be reserved in several names and split between the two hotels.

For this slight inconvenience, we get two worthwhile advantages: 1. A greater variety of roomtypes. For those to whom ambience is primary, there are suites with living rooms and a private door to the patio, at less than \$50 per night per person, tax included. For those who want to economize there are some nicely furnished doubles at just \$30 per person. Most of the rooms are in the \$35

to \$44 range per person. 2. We have protection against one of those hotel reservation foulups which sometimes occur and leave people with no rooms at all. There are enough rooms reserved at each hotel to accommodate all od us in an emergency.

Because of the wide variety of rooms and occupancy combinations possible, we are not going to try to describe them all here. Please, just make the decision to go and send your deposit. You'll be contacted personally to make a room assignment to your satisfaction.

If you are unable to stay the entire four days, you are still welcome and can be accommodated for whatever length your stay. Wives are welcome, too and invited to participate in all activities.

Registration will start Wednesday morning, March 17th, in the Hospitality Suite, where you'll receive a cordial greeting from our volunteer hostesses. Snacks and drinks will be served, and you'll get a brief orientation, plus help, in getting settled into your room. First-timers at this type of event will find counsel gladly given by experienced members.

We know that you'll want to spend as much time dressed as possible, so the Suite can be used for dressing if you arrive too early in the day for your room to be available. It will also be used for the room parties and as our communications center.

We are deeply endebted to Nichol (TX-303-W) who, as a ber of the planning group, made a trip to New Orleans at her own expense, to survey the hotels, and select our lodging.

As another measure of the extraordinary effort of the planning group to provide the very finest activity we have ever had, Dorothy (TX-15-H) is also planning to go to New Orleans before the Holiday En Femme, to make

sure that every detail of the delectable dining experience she is planning, is worked out satisfactorily.

Janice (TX-10-M) is busy acknowledging the Reservation Forms, assembling materials for the Registration Kits and preparing copy for the first HOLIDAY Newsletter - coming soon to those who have made reservations.

Linda (TX-21-B) is continuing preparations for the parties and programs. In addition, she has taken responsibilty for "girling" the Hospitality Suite and asks for volunteer hostesses to help with this important function.

And now, here's the BIG news as we prepare to go to press: The evidence is convincing that we are going to have the largest turnout in our history. With plenty of time still ahead for more to

come in, we have already received 16 Reservations and Deposits. It's time to ask for more rooms at the hotels. How many will be available? Don't press your luck — send YOUR reservation in without delay!

The Holiday En Femme offers you an equaled opportunity to savor life in the feminine role. It's the realization, in action, of our dreams — to move, to do, to see and be seen, and to be accepted — and to share with our sisters these feelings and experiences which nobody else can ever really understand.
