# Introduction

For the past two decades we have been unraveling the mystery surrounding the concept of gender as a social and cultural phenomenon rather than just a "psychosexual disorder." We have learned much about the social dynamics of gender shift, its determining factors, and effective coping strategies in dealing with gender-conflicted people.

This program will have two distinct parts: A. Symposium (9 a.m. - Noon) - A panel of presenters on relevant gender issues for the 90s with other approaches toward understanding the complexities of gender.

*B. Workshop* (1:30 - 4:00 p.m.) - New and diverse strategies for counseling and doing therapy with gender-conflicted clients. Several tested and useful "tools" will be presented, which can be used in connection with various coping strategies available to sex educators. This segment is open to registered counselors, therapists and other helping professionals only. A limit of 20-25 people has been set.

The All-Day Institute on Gender Issues for the 90s is sponsored by the Human Outreach & Achievement Institute (HOAI). It is presented in conjunction with International Foundation for Gender Education (IFGE) at its annual convention in San Francisco, Calif.
