



California Unity '97 What to expect in Long Beach - Mid April

'WEATHER'

Temperatures usually range in the high 60's to the low 70's. Evenings near the ocean can be quite cool.

"CLOTHING"

Medium weight clothing is best. Southern California is quite informal in its attitude. But there are a good many establishments that require proper attire. Please check attire requirements when making meal reservations at a restaurant.

"PAINTING THE TOWN 'PINK' - A WORD OF CAUTION

California law allows alcoholic beverages to be purchased between the hours of 6 am and 2 am the following morning. California drunk driving laws are among the strictest in the nation so please be responsible and use extreme caution by not drinking and driving. If you want to imbibe in alcoholic beverages select a designated driver, or better yet *take a taxi*, to and from any establishment you wish to visit. Most destinations off site of the convention require a ten to fifteen minute drive from the Queen Mary. If the authorities pull you over and determine that your blood alcohol level exceeds the legal level you go immediately to jail - there are no exceptions. Needless to say it can get very embarrassing and also very expensive. Be responsible -

CONVENTION RULES AND REGULATIONS

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Have a good time but remember to be responsible for your actions. Your are representing our community when you're out in public, so act accordingly.

2. We don't have a dress code but we do ask that everyone dress reasonably and responsibly. We expect conduct and dress to be within the normal, generally accepted standards of good taste that apply to any group of people attending an educational seminar and conference in a hotel. Please dress responsibly when you are in a public environment and avoid outlandish styles - lingerie only, extremely short mini-skirts that fail to cover the buttocks and genital areas, absurdly large breast forms, collars, leashed, etc.

2 Be considerate of others when you're taking picture (still or video). Ask permission before you take someone's photo. Recorders/Video Cameras are not allowed at any California Unity function without the written permission of the convention directors. No exceptions. Snapshot cameras are OK; just ask permission of anyone you wish to include in the picture.

4. The State of California has determined that the Queen Mary Hotel is a "NO SMOKING" facility except in designated areas. Consequently, smoking is not permitted in the meeting or dining areas. Your cooperation is appreciated.

5. California Unity reserves the right to remove anyone from the convention who is behaving in an irresponsible, dangerous, and/or illegal manner. This includes refusing to abide by the Rules and Regulation of California Unity and/or the hotel. Such persons forfeit registration, meal and activity fees.

HOTEL POLICIES

6. DO NOT abuse or be destructive to the hotel. This includes attaching signs, posters, etc. to the walls in your room, the hallways and the main convention area. Observe and follow all hotel rules (Continued on page 8)

concerning food, drinks, smoking (See No. 4) and restroom usage. Always be considerate of non-California Unity hotel guests. Please use proper decorum and behavior at all times. Showing respect and consideration for other guests helps our community make new friends and enhances our image.

7. <u>Rest room policy</u>. It is your responsibility as a California Unity Convention attendee to apply common sense with regard to public bathroom usage while at the event. Be considerate of others when you are using any public restroom.

The entire convention center of the Queen Mary has been set aside for our convention and one of the restrooms has been set aside for the use of our genetic female attendees only. Please be courteous and respect their privacy.

- Use the restroom appropriate to the gender role you are presenting.
- Be considerate of others who are using the restroom.
- Keep the restroom as clean as you found it.
- Keep the door closed if and when you use a stall.
- Absolutely no drugs, no smoking, no sex. (Anyone violating this rule will be removed from the convention immediately.)
- Please be mindful that negative comments to hotel management by other guests about our use of the restrooms causes major headaches for the convention staff.
- Exposing yourself is cause for immediate expulsion.
- Do not change your clothing (even pantyhose) in the restrooms. Go to your hotel room or, if you are not staying at the hotel ask at the Unity Information Table. They will be able to guide you to the appropriate area where you can take care of your needs.
- Remember that some genetic female guests using the rest room at the same time may be offended at you presence and we must be respectful to them.

8. Interfacing with the hotel staff. The hotel staff is there to provide for our comfort and security. Please avail yourselves of their services. If there is something in the convention area that in your estimation needs correcting, or if you would like an additional item provided, please contact the IFGE/California Dreamin' convention staff and they will coordinate with the appropriate hotel personnel.







She has been involved in numerous outreach programs, including lecturing to college audiences, and is always willing to talk to anyone - at almost any hour - to help them cope with gender confusion. She authored an amendment to the Cambridge Human Rights Ordinance protecting freedom of gender expression and identity (September 1996) and helped to organize the first-ever intersexed anti-"Intersex Genital Mutilation" demonstration in Boston (October 1996).



Vern has given extraordinary time and love to have the transgender community take its rightful place in history. With his late wife, Bonnie, he authored the book "Cross Dressing, Sex and Gender" published in 1993 and has written many articles on cross-gender behavior. He has received several professional awards, including one from the American Civil Liberties Union for establishing ACLU policy on gays, lesbians and crossdressers. Vern and Bonnie organized the first International Congress on Gender, Cross Dressing & Sex Issues at California State University, Northridge, in 1995. He is organizing the Bullough Collection to document the history of the transgender community in which he has worked for over 30 years.
