ANNUAL REPORT OF PRESIDENT

Writing an annual message to you this year is rather difficult as I am in the middle of trying to arrange my European trip, get a book published (How To Be a Woman Though Male--\$6.50--commercial yet!), write a couple of chapters for somebody else's book, start on my own autobiography that a publishers agent is crying for and still keep up with the usual supply of work. It's really too much!

And "too much" is about the theme of this message to you. The work entailed in running FPE is "too much" for both Fran and myself. It has been a labor of love since we are not on a salary and we both have lots of other demands on our time. Yet we both get complaints from prospects about the time taken to process their applications, from interview candidates and interviewers that they haven't been able to get together, and we get word of goings on in various chapters that are not in accordance with the rules, etc. All of these matters require time to write letters by either Fran or myself or both and it really is getting to be too much. There will have to be a change. Fran and I will be meeting in Chicago the end of July and will hopefully come up with some recommended changes as a result which will be announced to you later on. There would not be nearly as many complications in FPE if security was not involved, but this has always been our promise to you, that your security would be guarded at all costs. This has meant that we could not turn over the plain work of running the organization to others as this would require revealing names to them and that is not part of our commitment to you, the members, so there is nothing left but for Fran and I to do it all. In view of this, it does rub a little the wrong way when we get chewed out by somebody.

The world is quite different than it was nine years ago when FPE was conceived. Society is much more tolerant of a lot of things, FPism included. Thus people are more open about it, there are other publications dealing with all aspects of cross-dressing not just the heterosexual types that FPE was founded for. "Drag" on the street for homosexuals is no longer an invitation to police harassment of them in various cities and thus would not be for us. Individuals too are getting more open and coming out of their security closets. This is fine in many ways, but some of these with little or nothing to lose get very free in contacting all kinds of others through the mail and in passing those contacts around without much discrimination. This, of course, is their business and their right, but it makes it rather difficult to say the least in trying to run any sort of a secure organization which of necessity is made up not only of those who are security conscious, but others who are much less so. This means that the latter sometimes unthinkingly do things that jeopardize the former and trying to prevent this not only takes time but does nothing to add to Fran's or my popularity.

Some of our chapters are taking the bull by the horns (or should I say the cow by the ears) and doing things to add to the general public information. Delta Chapter was probably the most daring in that they invited a newspaper reporter and his wife to a chapter meeting and allowed him to interview several of them. Result: They got a great big, almost full-page write up in an Akron, Ohio paper. Congratulations to their openness and courage. Lambda in the Pacific Northwest and Alpha here in Los Angeles broke through old fears and staged banquets in hotels and had a good time for themselves and probably a little education for the managements too. Alpha again had one of their open houses in which all friends of members were invited to come to a meeting. I gave a little talk on the origins and purpose of FPE, refreshments were served and we broke up into a lot of little groups in which members did their "educating". Everybody had a

real good time and we think we did some good. We had about 35 outsiders there. I'd like to see other groups elsewhere break out of their "group closets" (by which I mean closed meetings) and invite other people, groups or individuals to come, observe and find that we aren't so weird after all.

Well, I'll close with my greetings to you all. Some of you I will see on my swing around the country, to Scandinavia and England and can deliver my own greetings, but have to take this way of reaching you others. Oh yes, I almost forgot, as usual the rumor is already about that "Virginia is going to Copenhagen for surgery". I sometimes get the notion that some of them would be much relieved if I would have it. But don't fear, this trip is for public relations and education and nothing more. I'll still be my own sweet self upon my return. Bye now!

Report from the Executive Secretary

Another year and another Annual Report by yours truly, the sixth in a row, I believe. Our membership numbers 368 as of this writing, which is 7 more than last year's report. We gained about 100 new members and lost nearly the same number. Actually, we can look at FPE from two sides; one being that we have not really grown or that we have hit our high level of number of members and the other being that we served a very effective purpose (that of a mission) in helping the 100 we lost as well as the present total. If we look back over the years that I have been your Executive Secretary, our membership has totaled over 1,000 and with the years that Virginia handled things by herself, there were another 500 or so. That adds up to a lot of people to help along the way to self-acceptance and happiness.

In the money department, we did better this year by ending up with some money in the bank and showing a few dollars more "left" than the last report. This was brought about by cutting corners wherever possible such as not sending the newsletter to the non-paids after January plus cutting down on our public relations spending. However, some money was budgeted for public relations that will fall into next year's expenses, thus it didn't show this time. But overall, we did alright financially for the year.

As far as growth is concerned, perhaps the best way to measure it is from the chapter point of view. We received 26 petitions for chapters this year which is five more than we had last year. But in truth, some of our chapters are quite inactive at present, so even with five new ones we are about the same as last year. I believe that chapter growth is extremely important because it shows initiative on the local level which is where the most good can be done. The more activity in our cities, the more meaningful FPE is to our members and the longer they stay around. Leadership is vital to any organization and ours is certainly no different. Without more members taking the initiative to organize their efforts geographically to help each other, the chances for FPE to grow is limited and we will soon start to move backward.

On the International scene FPE or its counter parts are growing by leaps and bounds. England, with its Beaumont Society boasts that it will soon have more members than the U.S. and we must congratulate these gals for doing a superb job of building their organization. Northern Europe and Scandinavia are also doing very nicely with a very fine organization also called FPE. It seems that they are gaining greater public acceptance all the time. Perhaps we should try to learn more from our International Sisters.

Administration wise we are doing about the same as last year except that we are even further behind in membership correspondence. There just isn't time enough to go around and in truth, time is getting more scarce. There just doesn't seem to be time enough to keep you all happy or to do all of the things that you would like done. We did manage to get out the New Membership Guide early last year and hope that it has helped to answer the multitude of new member-questions that had gone unanswered before. Our questionnaire of last year didn't really tell us much in that about 80% of the ideas were of a complaining nature and most of the rest were suggestions on projects that we had already tried, such as a more personal newsletter like the old Femme Mirror. In all honesty, I must admit to limited talent as your editor (if any) and that I am just not skillful enough to write in a much different fashion than I have. But we still greatly encourage you to send in your ideas for improvement of the Forum and will be happy to try anything within our power and means.
