

Mrs. S. E. Seelye entered the Federal army May 25, 1861, and remained until April 22, 1863, when she left for home on account of prolonged sickness without her sex ever having been discovered. She was in many engagements and was conspicuous for her gallantry, being known as Private Franklin Thompson, Company F, Second Regiment Michigan Infantry. She is now seeking to have the charge of desertion brought against her set aside so as to secure a pension. The officers and men of her company still alive all testify to her courage and exemplary conduct while in the army.—New Orleans Times-Democrat.
