

## Lynne Carter

"Grotesque, cruel parody is a tragic quality the 'drag queens' exploit in their merciless impersonations. I see this and it upsets me," Lynne said.

He found no fun in playing pain or getting laughs from it. "I never did Judy Garland" he told me, "because I knew her and found her to be a terribly unhappy, sad and complicated woman. In death, even more so."

It was with Marlene Dietrich, however, that Lynne created his most memorable characterization, beyond parody to great acting.

In 1977, Lynne suffered two massive heart attacks and was scheduled to undergo open heart surgery that

fall. A number of show business notables, including Jerry Herman, John Kander, Fred Ebb, Cy Coleman, Hermoine Gingold and Rita Moreno staged a tribute to Lynne at the Edison Theater to raise money to cover the hospital costs. Loving friends filled the theater to capacity.

As Lynne left Provincetown in 1978, he would not look back. He spent most of the trip telling stories and doing 'bits.' He was leaving an important part of his life behind him and entering the final years of his career.

Ahead were select dates at preferred clubs in Cincinnati, Philadelphia and New York, among others. In the Summer of 1979, he headlined the Grand Central Resort in Atlantic City. On New Year's Eve he played the Talk of the Town in Yonkers, a tradition he honored for Marty the owner and a close friend.

His last engagement was at the St. Regis Hotel in New York City in the revue "Hurray for Hollywood." New York was buried under a foot of show. Only a few people attended. Lynne played as if it were standing room only. He was working on his autobiography, "It Wasn't All A Drag," when he died. Marty Richards, a noted producer, has promised that this project will be completed in some form.

Lynne's dream was to play Albin in the Broadway musical La Cage aux Folles." He and George Hearn were the only performers who auditioned for the part. Even after Hearn got the role, Lynne tutored him in the art he spent 40 years perfecting. Hearn won a Tony for his performance.

Lynne was hoping to do one more engagement in Philadelphia in February if he had the strength. Words of consolation at that time seemed banal, inappropriate.

"I think we are all here for certain reasons," Lynne said in The Advocate in 1977. "We all have a niche in life and I truly believe I am doing what I was meant to do, to be a clown and make people laugh and go out feeling good. I think I've served my purpose."















