Food For Thought

This month's fare is a great tasting dish that will make brunch a treat to remember. It comes to us from Judee's recipe collection and is very easy to make.

Swiss Egg Bake

1 10 1/2 oz can cream of chicken soup
1/2 cup milk
2 tsp. instant minced onion
1/2 tsp. prepared mustard
4 oz. processed swiss cheese
6 eggs
6 1/2 in. thick slices french bread
snipped parsley

In saucepan, combine soup.milk.onion and mustard. Cook and stir until smooth and heated through. Remove from heat; stir in cheese till melted. Pour 1 cup sauce into 10x6 in. baking dish. Break eggs into sauce. carefully spoon remaining sauce around eggs. Stand french bread slices around edges with crusts up. Bake in 350 deg. oven for 20 mins. or until eggs are set. Garnish with parsley. Makes 6 servings.


