Feminine Footprints

These last few weeks have been and still are very trying times for me in my new femininemasculine lifestyle. I have started to slip into depression, sometimes very deeply, and the thoughts going through my head are not very pretty ones. They range from revenge to going back into the closet to suicide.

On the 11th of November I was fired from my job of over eight years. The reasons given to me were my work performance and my attitude. I believe the real reasons were sexual harassment, sexual discrimination and bigotry. The powers to be and everyone else where I worked knew of my crossdressing. The four top company officials also knew that I am a bi-gendered transsexual.

During the final two months of my employment I went through much sexual harassment and discrimination. Jokes were made about me behind my back and to my face, my feminine name and mailing address appeared on the company bulletin board (along with IXE's), and on my wall calendar was written. "Arlena Marie Parrish - Crossdresser convention at 8:00 pm". This was the last entry on it.

All the harassment and discrimination was aimed to force me to quit. This failed so I was fired instead. Now, after four weeks of looking for a new job, I find that I have been blackballed from further employment by my former bigoted bosses. They are telling prospective employers that I am a crossdresser, that I go out publicly as a woman and that I am gay, which I consider an invasion of my personal privacy. I have contacted a law firm and the ACLU and will be filing suit against my former employers and the people involved for harassment, discrimination and invasion of privacy.

Lately, I have come upon a piece of literature that has started to affect my life and my outlook. I include it with this article in my own edited version. I hope you will like it and use it to soothe your troubles. I am not a very religious person, but it is helping me to stay sane.

"Feminine Footprints"

One night a woman had a dream. She dreamed she was walking along the beach with the Lord. Across the sky flashed scenes from her life. For each scene she noticed two sets of feminine footprints in the sand; one belonged to her and the other to the Lord.

When the last scene in her life shown before her, she looked back at the footprints. She noticed that many times in the path of her life there was only one set of footprints. She also noticed this occurred at the lowest and saddest times of her life. This bothered her and she questioned the Lord about it. "Lord, you said that once I decided to follow you, you'd walk with me all the way. But I have noticed that during the most troublesome times of my life there is only one set of footprints. I don't understand that when I needed you the most you would leave me."

The Lord replied, "My precious child, I love you and I would never leave you. During your times of trial and suffering, when you see only one set of feminine footprints, it was then that I carried you."

Transsexual Issues: Sexual Preference by Heather Peerson

I am still amazed that so many transsexuals who say they understand that Gender Identity and Sexual Preference are not the same, still ask questions like, "why would someone go through all of this only to end up living in a relationship with another woman? Why not just stay a man?"

As long as we continue to think of heterosexuality as normal and homosexuality as abnormal we will continue to ask such questions. We must learn to accept the fact that just as transsexualism is a normal part of our society so to is homosexuality By normal, I mean that both are naturally occurring phenomena which have existed throughout time in almost all civilizations. Since each is a separate phenomenon it is logical to assume that there would be a development of both heterosexual and homosexual transsexuals.

Just as it is believed that Gender Identity is established by the age of two years old, sexual preference is also established at a very early age. A person may find they have a gender conflict but they may not have questions about what they are attracted to.

The relationships between two men, two woman and a woman and a man are all different, whether we speak of sexual or social relationships. For me, the ways in which I interacted with men and women on a social level as a man never felt proper and my body image is wrong for a male. These have nothing to do with my being attracted to women or men as sexual partners except that I was also expected to perform as a man with a woman. This relationship also felt wrong.

We are a people of proof. We seek proof for the existence of God and we seek proof for the existence of life. When a person died in the past, we held that when the heart stopped so did life. We now know that as long as the brain is functioning there is a chance that life exists. It is the brain which determines life. So too we must learn that it is the brain which determines gender and not the body. I recently saw a show in which a young boy appeared. He had no body Irom the waist down. The fact that he has no genitalia does not make him less of a man. His brain tells him he is a man. Yet what if he determines that he is really a woman. Would the fact that there is no genitalia make it easier for society to accept his change?

My decision to live my life as a woman is based on the signals my brain has continued to send me ever since I can remember, my social relationships and my body image. It is not based on my sexual preference. I do hope that one day I will be able to find a woman who will accept and want me as a woman, both before and after my operation. If not, however, I am able to say that even if I spend the rest of my days without a partner I must spend them as the woman my brain says I am.

From Our Readers

I've enjoyed reading *Innerview* every month as it helps me to keep abreast (no pun intended). In the November issue "Linda's Corner" the first 2-1/2 sentences trouble me:

> "If there's one thing all crossdressers have in common; its that we all like to be noticed by men."

I'm sorry but I can't agree with or believe that statement! I hope that you understand my position. <u>I want to be noticed by Women!</u>

I understand that there are quite a number of cross-dressers and women outnumber males in cross-dressing. I also know that many male to females are potential transsexuals- some are just interested in attracting men.

I'm not condemning these people for what their reasons are for cross-dressing- I'm sure there are many.

With me- if you want to call me a crossdresser- my behavior may be more androgynous than that of a typical male, but my reasons for cross-dressing are perhaps different that the mainstream of individuals who frequent Cross-Port.

While I enjoy the softness of the fabric from the clothing and the jaunty swish from the skirts, I <u>love</u> the overall "pretty" silhouette of the style.

It's a style and comfort that allows me to be as strong as I wish, as soft as I wish, and basically a relief from elevated machismo in everyday generalized beliefs that some members in society expect from males.

I wish not to have surgeons change my body, nor do I wish to pretend I'm something that I'm not. I only wish to live in a harmonious state where all people can be what they want to be without peer pressure.

So I say to those of you who cross-dress to gain the attention of men- Go for it and enjoy yourselves- you only live once!

As for me; I will continue to cross-dress for my own self pleasure and hope to perhaps be appreciated by a real woman!

Gender Research

Cross-Port was contacted recently by a university professor working on a research project involving passing women and female-to-male transsexuals. While the vast majority of our readers are genetically male, we are including her request for assistance as a public service to the cross-dressing community because she wishes to get information from women who have, at any time in their lives, lived as men.

Holly Devor, the researcher and author of <u>Gender Blending: When Two is Not Enough</u>, stresses that (1) complete confidentiality will be observed at all times, (2) that she is a researcher and is not involved in the medical or helping professions, (3) contacting her for further information implies no commitment to participate in any further activities related to this or any other project, and (4) participants may choose what parts of the project they wish to participate in if they prefer not to complete all parts.

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


