National News Houston Group Told to Reorganize

In a letter received by Alpha Zeta and dated Nov. 9, 1987, it was stated that Tri-Delta will reorganize into two groups. One retaining the name Tri-Delta and being a Tri-Ess chapter and a second being created, if desirable, for those previous members of the old group that "do not want" or "can not be" members of Tri-Ess National.

In a second letter received by Alpha Zeta and written to the old group by Carol Beecroft, it was stated that one must be a "heterosexual male" in order to join Tri-Ess National and, only Tri-Ess National members will be allowed to join the new Tri-Delta. The Tri-Ess National organization will no longer tolerate a chapter that allows "nonnational" members.

In addition, the letter from Ms. Beecroft stated that a majority of the Tri-Delta membership are not members of the national organization and therefore can not be members of a local Tri-Ess chapter. Later in the letter she states that "A large number of the sisters who belong to Tri-Delta would prefer a chapter whose goals and philosophies are more consistent with those set up by the National". She also states that a prospective member of a local chapter can only attend three (3) meetings of the local group without joining "Tri-Ess National". This is in conflict with the bylaws of other Tri-Ess chapters (including Alpha Zeta).

The Tri-Delta letter also implied that there would be some cooperation between the new Tri Delta group and a second group, "If it should exist", but that it would be a separate organization with meetings and events separate from Tri-Delta.

Finally, Ms. Beecroft's letter stated that the new group will have to resubmit their bylaws to the national organization for approval before attaining chapter status.

(Ed: Several questions and comments come to mind in reflecting on the preceding news item. It might be that the majority of the membership of Tri-Delta were not either: heterosexual, or male, or possibly they felt that Tri-Ess National membership was not providing them with something worth it's price. In another light, it might be, as many in other areas including Phoenix, that we are a small subculture and in many places it is difficult to muster a critical mass of people that will catalyze a group to emerge. Also, the crossdressing and transgender desires that all of us share, are a common bond that brings us together for the purpose of personal growth, self satisfaction and the want to help others who are still struggling with themselves. Sexual desires need not enter into the picture if the group's bylaws are such that this area is taboo. Also there are individuals in all groups that are TG, on hormones and desire to live life in a female role. Are these individuals to be excluded. since they do not strictly fit the "Masculine" criteria. These questions are present in all Tri-Ess groups and I would assume that every group will continually have to address them. It is tough to turn away a good person who would be a credit to a group because he admits that he has had a male partner or that he is contemplating surgery some day.)

Food For Thought

This month we are going to give you an idea of what to do with some of that turkey that you will be wondering what to do with about 2 days after Thanksgiving. Why not export it south of the border and transform it into:

Turkey Enchiladas

2 cups chopped, cooked turkey 1 cup chopped onions 5 tbsp. butter 1 4oz can chopped green chile peppers 1/4 cup flour 3/4 tsp. salt 2 1/2 cups chicken broth 1 cup sour cream 1 1/2 cups shredded monterey Jack cheese

1 1/2 cups shredded monterey Jack cheese 12 medium flour tortillas

In a large saucepan cook onion in 2 tbsps. butter till tender, combine in a bowl with chopped turkey and chile peppers and set aside. In the same saucepan melt 3 tbsps. butter, blend in flour and salt. Stir in chicken broth, cook and stir till thickened and bubbly. Remove from heat, stir in sour cream and 1/2 cup of cheese. Stir 1/2 cup of this sauce into the turkey mixture. Place about 1/4 cup of the turkey mixture into each tortilla, roll up and arrange seam side down in a 9x13 pan. Pour remaining sauce over the enchiladas, sprinkle with the remaining cheese. Bake uncovered in 350 deg. oven for 25 mins. or till bubbly. Serves 6.


