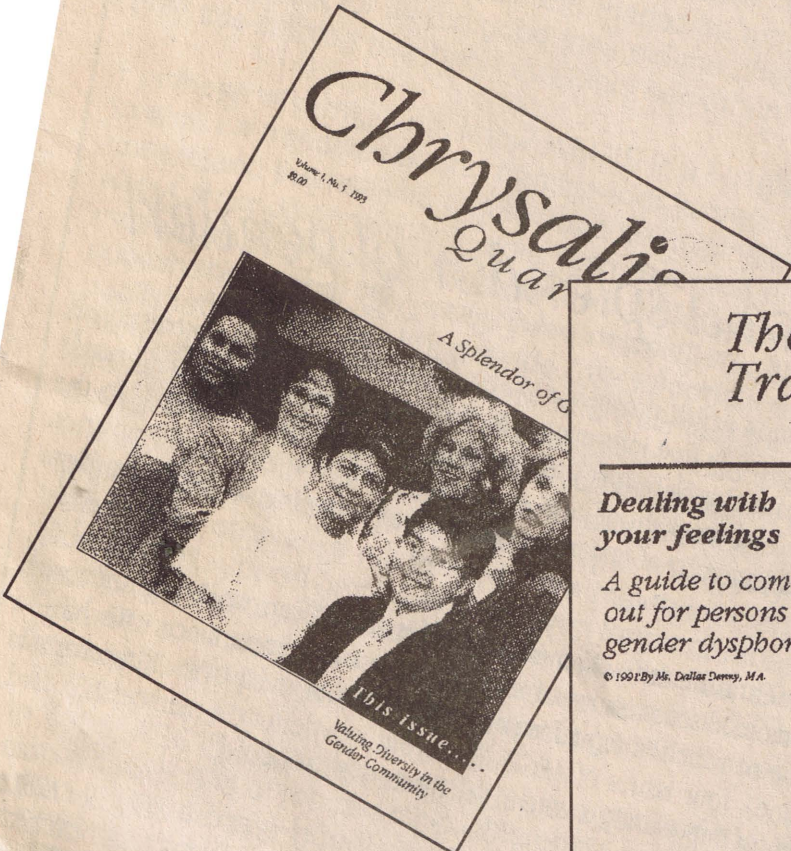

Welcome to our catalog.


In these pages you'll find some of the finest printed and recorded material available on transsexualism and crossdressing. We've carefully chosen our products for high quality of information and low cost. We're proud to offer such a wide variety of top-notch books and tapes.

It wasn't all that long ago that I made a trip to the library and discovered that there were only two books on the subject in the whole world (and they were both checked out!). That's what I thought, at least. Later, I was able to locate over 5000 books, book chapters, and journal and magazine articles! Many had been there all along, of course, but for all the good they did me, they might as well not have been. Oh, if only this catalog had been available back then!

For those who might not know, AEGIS is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit clearinghouse for information on transsexual and transgender issues. We work hard to help transpersons understand themselves and to educate helping professionals and the general public about a condition which is older than recorded history. To this end, we operate this mail-order bookstore, selling our own materials and material written by others. We publish the journal *Chrysalis*, three newsletters, and assorted booklets (and we just published our first book!); provide free information and referrals via U.S. mail, telephone, FAX, and e-mail; operate and maintain the National Transgender Library & Archive; and conduct scientific research projects (currently we're working on the first outcome study of transsexualism which is not based on a clinical treatment program). We provide speakers to civic organizations, churches, universities, and businesses, and advocate for the rights of transpeople when they are discriminated against, persecuted, or otherwise mistreated. We maintain a large database of helping professionals and support groups and an even larger database of articles and books (which was published by Garland in 1994 with the title *Gender Dysphoria: A Guide to Research*). In short, we do whatever we can to educate transpersons, helping professionals, and the general public about gender issues.

In 1995, AEGIS became a membership organization. We offer general and professional categories of membership. Members receive discounts on the material in this catalog. That's one good reason to join. Another is that members get *Chrysalis*, *AEGIS News* (our newsletter), a membership card, and other goodies. But the best reason to join is to financially support our work. What we do is important, and it's not an area in which the federal government or other grant-making agencies are eager to provide monies.

Transsexual people and crossdressers have long been stigmatized in our society. The general public and even many helping professionals have little idea of what we are really like. We are stereotyped, but we are not stereotypes. We are as variable as any other group of people; we differ only in the fact that we are transgendered. We know the contents of this catalog will help to dispel some of the myths about us.
