





Then: **Pharaoh Aahhotep I** of Egypt led armies against Thebes, which united Egypt under one rule between 1570 and 1546 BC.

Then: **Pharaoh Hatshepsut** of Egypt (1472-58) wore male clothing and was depicted shirtless as having a male chest and masculine physique. He came to the throne about 1512, was crowned as pharaoh and adopted a Horus name (a royal name limited to kings) and the full pharaonic regalia, including a beard, also traditionally worn only by the king.

Then: Si Mahmoud Essadi, also known as Laila Mahmuda, was born Isabelle Eberhardt and lived as a nomad in the late nineteenth century in Arabia and wrote Departures, The Oblivion Seekers, Prisoner of Dunes, The Passionate Nomad and In the Shadow of Islam.



Sheik Taff al-Khalifa. FTM Prince

Now: Taff al-Khalifa is a member of the royal family of Bahrain, nephew of King Hamad bin Isa al Khalifa. He grew up the Princess (Sheika) Latifa of Bahrain and was educated at the prestigious Weston Birt girls school in Gloucestershire UK. He returned to Bahrain at age 16, announced his decision to enter the army, and entered the British military academy

at Sandhurst. Ordered to return to Bahrain, he was identified during roundups of the gender community by the police. The pressure to marry forced him to escape and request political asylum in the UK, where a kidnapping attempt failed. He cannot return to his home, since Islamic law can condemn to him to death, so he lives in exile.

A Bahraini is going to court in a bid to legally recognise new status as a man. Lawyer Fowzia Mohammed Janahi, who is acting for the 30-year-old, says her client has filed a case to be recognised as a man by the Health Ministry and General Directorate of Nationality, Passports and Residence. A hearing is expected to get a CPR card, driving licence and passport with a

new male identity. "She cannot physically have children, all her hormones are male and she even has a voice like a man. She has undergone blood tests in Jordan. At first her family did not agree, but now they support her decision. She feels difficult when she goes outside and wears the Abaya as people say: 'Why is a man wearing the black dress?' The lawyer, who is a member of the Bahrain Bar Society, won a landmark case of a similar nature last year when the Bahrain courts agreed to another Bahraini, aged 30, being legally recognised as a man. She has 11 reports from the Al Khalidi Medical Centre in Jordan and one each from the Al Nafees Hospital and Shifa Al Jazeera Medical Centre in Bahrain to support the sex change decision. "A lot of people called me and said we have the same case. But they do not have money for all the tests and reports and the operations. People have to travel outside for treatment." The Quran permits the operation in the right circumstances. "The case is very difficult in the Gulf," she said. "In Kuwait there have been nine cases and all were rejected. They also have cases in Saudi Arabia and Dubai, but the law does not agree with it. Maybe outside (Bahrain) it is easier to change, but we are Muslim people." (Bew, Geoffrey. Then: Cornet Alexandrov Alexander Vasilevich, born Nadezhda Durova, joined the Russian cavalry at 23, where he served with distinction as an officer for more than nine years. He was awarded a silver St.George's cross for saving a wounded officer at Guttstadt in 1806 by Emperor Alexander I who ordered him to St.Petersburg in male uniform and after meeting him, approved his continued military service in the Mariupol cavalry regiment. At the 1812 battle of Borodino he volunteered to serve as Field-Marshal Kutuzov's orderly. "What's your name and how old are you", Kutuzov asked the youthful-looking officer with a high voice and no beard. "Cornet Alexandrov", he said. Kutuzov stood up, hugged the cornet and said that he had heard a lot about him and was glad to meet him. Two

decades later he wrote his famous memoir The Cavalry Maiden, Russia's first autobiography.

Now: **Haris**'s original name was Kadicha. He was born as a girl in 1926. The little girl was born having both women's and men's anatomy. The parents decided to register their child as a girl. "I did not act like a girl. I fought with other kids, played football," Haris remembers. The girl's breasts started growing together with male puberty during the adolescent phase. "After that I decided that I had more male character traits in me. I cut my hair short, we gave away my women's clothes to our neighbors. Finally, I told everybody that my new name was Haris. I decided to be a man. I got the true men's profession too - I drove a tractor." Nurgalam Gilmetdinova moved to Haris's town soon after that. "I liked him a lot indeed. But when people told me about his secret, I was really scared. I decided to stay away from him for a while. I realized that I could not live without him. My father blessed our marriage," Nurgalam said. Haris and Nurgalam could not register their marriage, though, because Haris was officially registered as a woman. "I am still listed as a woman," Haris says. "When he was young, he was very good as a man. He had women's bosom, yes, but it did not bother me. Nobody has seen it, but me after all. We cannot have children, it is true, but this is the will of Allah," Nurgalam said. (78 year old becomes a happy family man. Pravda Russia, 21 October 2004)

Then: Hua Mu Lan, also known as Fa Mulan, joined the Chinese army and fought for twelve years in the fifth century in China, so impressing his commanding officer that he offered him his daughter in marriage. Hua Mu Lan is celebrated in plays and poetry and was the subject of an animated film by Disnev.

The Chinese term for FTM is Bian xing ren (change sex person). The availability of SRS in China since 1983 led 'Kam' (FTM) to tell his story in the South China Morning Post (9th Jan. 1994 Living life as husband and wife. South China Morning Post, Reporter Ruth Mathewson)

A-gang, the first Chinese FTM to have phalloplasty surgery, received a marriage certificate from the government, the Xi'an Evening Post reported. The 29-year-old was married to Xiaoli in a ceremony in Chengdu, Southwest China's Sichuan Province. The couple had been living together since 2001 but could only wed after A-gang's phalloplasty at a Shenzhen hospital in 2003 so his identity card could be changed. At the age of 17, he left his home in Neijiang, Sichuan, when people started gossiping about his gender. A-gang went for an operation at a Shenzhen hospital in April. The operation was a

success and he was discharged from the hospital on May 31. Then he applied for a gender change on his identity card and residence record and got the approval several days later. He waved the card to Xiaoli, saying "I am your man now." (China Daily, 2 January 2004)



Gengzi, a 31 year old graphic designer from the Ningxia Hui region had phalloplasty surgery in Guangzhou, the Southern Metropolis Daily reported. Gengzi already had mastectomy and hysterectomy Fujian Province. (Gengzi's Story. Shenzhen Daily, 19 July 2005) China Zhongshan Hospital, Xiamen, east China's Fujian Province. Geng Junlan, underwent four operations in a year to successfully become a man, now called Geng Zi. Dr Xiu Zhifu, chief of department of orthopedics at Zhongshan Hospital, claimed that Geng Zi has already been recognized as a true man, the Southeast Express reported. Geng Zi said, "My parents applied for a new identification card on my behalf." Nan, Y. (Girl went under knife. becoming a man. China Daily 31 March 2006)

Then: Professional athlete jockey Bill Smith rode on North Queensland bush tracks for many years. He retired to Innot Hot Springs, near Mount Garnett. In 1975 Smith became ill and was taken to Herberton Hospital, near Cairns and when he died an inquiry revealed that W. Smith had been born in Sydney in 1886 as Wilhemena Smith, had been orphaned early in life and spent time as a seaman and as a miner.

Henry Shawcross is a 26 year old with an A B.Arts at UWA writing his PhD titled "Self-made men: the masculinity of FTMs" Henry Shawcross, Torque, 3(5), October

Alex MacFarlane, an intersex activist from Perth has become the first person in Australia - and probably the world - to hold a passport acknowledging that not everyone is male or female, reports Queensland Pride. Alex MacFarlane, 48, is intersex and wanted a passport recognising this medical fact. Alex is 47XXY, a form of androgyny shared by at least one in every 1500 to 2000 babies. Alex's birth certificate, issued in Victoria, says "indeterminate - intersex" with an "X" in the sex field. (Queensland Pride No. 167, 24 January 2003

As many as 40,000 Australians don't have standard chromosomes. Tonight on Four Corners, new and challenging science on the question of gender. Associate Professor Vincent Harley is looking at a further 54 genes that have been discovered since SRY. Ten years ago, at 29, Kevin heard for the first time about gender reassignment surgery. Kevin started hormone treatment. Two years later, he had chest surgery followed by a hysterectomy. Jennifer and Kevin received an email from an officer in the federal Attorney-General's Department. It warned if they got married, Kevin was liable for a penalty of up to two years jail. Rachael Wallbank decided to fight the case. Justice Chisholm determined that Kevin at the time of his marriage was a man and therefore the marriage

was legal. The appeal went to the full bench of the Family Court. It also decided in Kevin's favour. Kevin and Jennifer are now happily married, living with their two children in suburban Sydney. (Cohen, J. The Gender Puzzle. 4Corners - ABC TV, 25 July

The Family Court of Australia authorised administration of hormonal therapies for a 13 year-old known as "Alex" that had lived as a boy from a young age, shunning dresses and dolls for tanks and swords. The child's primary school principal said that the child had worn nappies because he refused to use the girls' toilets. "When he went on grade six camp, (he) did Indian arm wrestles with all the boys and, of course, beat everybody," the principal told the family court. He joined the cricket team and refused to line up with girls at school assemblies. The application was supported by Alex's treating doctors, family members, the schools that Alex has attended, and by psychiatric specialists working in the field of gender identity dysphoria. The Court authorised the staged administration of the hormonal treatment recommended by the experts until Alex is 18 years old. The implementation of the treatment will be in the hands of Alex's treating doctors and Alex himself. The Court's orders allowed Alex to enroll in school under a male first name. It also gave approval for an application to make the same change to the name recorded on his birth certificate. (Family Court of Australia. Media Release 13 April 2004. www.thewest.com.au)

Melbourne, Victoria -- A 15-YEAR-OLD Melbourne girl who lives life as a boy, would be one of the youngest sex-swap patients in Australia if she has her wish. The family were referred to Kew surgeon Simon Ceber by Monash Medical Centre's gender dysphoria clinic. The girl dresses, speaks, and is treated like a boy and has long since used a boy's name.

Craig Andrews had hormone therapy and surgery at 35. Since setting up a support and advocacy group called FTM Australia, he has talked to many men. "The startling thing is they have never been in touch with anyone else [like them] before, and they all say, From my very first memories I thought I was going to be a boy'." Melbourne psychiatrist, Dr Herbert Bower instigated the world's first search for genes linked to gender several years ago. Bower has treated more than 1000 people with gender identity issues. Those who attend the Melbourne clinic have donated blood for an expanded gene hunt being carried out by Associate Professor Vincent Harley of Prince Henry's Institute of Medical Research in Melbourne and Professor Eric Vilain of the University of California. Then: William Brown, African American Naval Officer. A newspaper report in September 1815 mentioned "a female[-bodied] African who had served in the Navy for upwards of eleven years" before being discovered. He was named William Brown and held the responsible position of Captain of the Foretop. He is described as being about 32 years old and 5'4" tall." In spite of the press reports Brown rejoined his ship later that year and was appointed Captain of the Forecastle.

Now: James Johnson Nigerian athlete Former Super Falcons player, lyabo Abade, has successfully undergone a sex change operation in the United States. Abade, a confirmed hermaphrodite, left Nigeria for the operation early last year after a series of failed attempts to correct the abnormality that led to his being dropped from the female national team. He now bears the name James Johnson. The Falcon player did the final operation at Midway Hospital, San Vincente Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. A senior consultant to the hospital, surgeon, Dr Gary Alter, was the leader of the team that operated on the Nigerian. Johnson spent four weeks in the hospital after the operation and three more recuperating. The player had undergone a series of tests, revealing that there was a preponderance of male hormones. The surgery was funded from Nigeria. \$29,200 was given to Johnson for the surgery. BOTHSIDES NOW A Book Review By Levi Alter



Both Sides Now: One Man's Journey Through Womanhood by Dhillon Khosla. Tarcher (March 16, 2006) ISBN: 1585424722

On the way to rebuilding the temple that is now his body, he stumbled upon his soul . . .

Both Sides Now is a vivid and compelling account of one man's search for wholeness, leading through multiple, complex, and life-threatening surgeries that not only transformed him physically, but emotionally and spiritually.

In this spellbinding memoir Dhillon shares his extraordinary journey to reclaim his manhood – a journey that would ultimately lead through fifteen surgeries, one of which almost claimed his life. This is a book that no one can put down until it's finished. The gripping story cannot be stopped until it finally reaches its conclusion.

Dhillon was born in Belgium to an East Indian father and a German mother. After spending his childhood in Europe, Dhillon completed his education in the United States, earning degrees in psychology and law. Shortly after turning 28, he came across an article about men who were born female-bodied and had undergone surgeries to reclaim their male identity. As soon as he began reading about surgeries, Dhillon knew he was not alone.

Dhillon dedicates his book to FTM David Reimer and thanks past FTM International president James Green in his acknowledgments. Although *Both Sides Now* misses the depth of conveying the transition experience of FTMs revealed by reporter John Colapinto in *As Nature Made Him: The Boy Who Was Raised as a Girl* or the breadth of demonstrating the diversity of the FTM community displayed by professional writer James Green in *Becoming a Visible*

Man, Dhillon propels the reader forward relentlessly with vivid descriptions of his surgeries.

Part 1:

Excavating the Boy begins in July 1997 at age 28 when he is in the female body of the beautiful high-powered attorney, Asha. He starts attending FTM International meetings and calling the FTM International help line. FTM International gives him the road map that he needs to navigate his transition journey. He then begins the road journal of his suspenseful trip month by month.

Green light:

The next month (chapter) he begins therapy to get his hormone and surgery letters and discloses at his work.

The following month he discloses to his family, who are supportive but have never been able to give Asha, who now names himself Dhillon, all he craves from his relationship with them. In this chapter he writes, "Until I was able to express my true self, there was always a sense that the love that came my way was not truly meant for me." Dhillon is certain that he must have hormones and surgery to become the man he knows he has the potential to be.

Dangerous curves ahead:

The next month we careen with him through the perilous interview

where he almost loses control at the wheel as a therapist tries to deny him autonomy and withhold the hormone and surgery letters he was promised. Dhillon calls upon all the negotiating skill at his command as an attorney and maneuvers past all obstacles in his way in this harrowing encounter that looms with disaster. Dhillon recognizes that less skillful (less highly educated) FTMs would not have been able to overcome the odds as he writes, "My God, I have a degree in psychology, have worked as a counselor, and I am an articulate lawyer. I have all the hallmarks of a functional member of society. And yet I almost didn't make it in there." Later in his journey Dhillon meets competent professional therapists who are helpful to him who are trans themselves and are experienced in working with surgeons.



Building the Temple begins the next month as with hormone and surgery letters in hand, Dhillon shapes his male body with chest surgery like the photos he saw in Loren Cameron's book *Body Alchemy* by San Francisco surgeon Dr. Michael Brownstein. He perceptively notes how his physical body looks determines how he is seen and how that in turn affects his partner as he writes, "I found it interesting that based on who they thought I was, she was either demoted to "friend" [when he was seen as Asha the woman] or promoted to "wife" [when he was seen as Dhillon the man]. And none of it had anything to do with her."

Tunnel:

Throughout his long journey Dhillon shares again and again how vital it is to him to have the men of FTM International helping him. But the roadmap of his journey diverges when Dhillon, as a successful post-transition attorney, cannot tolerate listening to issues other than his own driving need for surgery. He reads about the experiences of incarcerated transmen of color and abruptly cancels his FTM International Newsletter subscription. He contrasts his own brand of manliness with "butch" masculinity, "effeminate" gay transmen, "pear shaped" men who do not have the lean physique he prizes and transgender men who cannot afford the expensive

surgeries he feels are necessary to be a man. He admits, "I had to face the realization that I had spent so much of my life unloving and unkind to myself in a most profound and fundamental way," and "In keeping myself hidden for so long, I, too, had been blind. I had never really seen the world was filled with so much love," and yet he is unable to appreciate the diversity in the world of men of FTM International as he focuses single-minded on his over-riding goal to have surgery at all costs.

Detour:

Dhillon is convinced that the body makes the man and relentlessly

pursues lower surgery. Even his dreams are haunted with his quest for surgery as he writes, "I got a strong visual image of myself as a fetus in the womb. And I had this tiny penis.' And my mother said, 'It reminds me of when handicapped people talk about how in their dreams their limbs are always normal and they are walking--you know, when we dream, we see ourselves as whole." He reluctantly settles at first for "a tiny penis" with metadoiplasty with Dr. Donald Laub.

Red light:

Dhillon's lower surgery completely fails. He is left with a stub where his urethral lengthening through his penis failed and two deflated, empty pockets where both of his testicular implants became infected and were removed.


U-turn:

This is where Dhillon amazes the reader. He bravely strikes off in another direction. Dhillon's journey and his book end in April 2001 with his final radial forearm phalloplasty (Dr. Pierre Brassard \$34K). He finally reaches his

destination as he poignantly writes, "I had a dream about having to get an EKG for my penis. I mentioned the dream to a close friend, saying, 'Isn't that ridiculous? --I mean, an EKG for my penis?' I was laughing. But my friend wasn't laughing. Her eyes were wide open as they looked into mine. 'It's not ridiculous. It's a symbol. You're getting your heart.'"

Finish line:

Dhillon's odyssey to reclaim his manhood is an edge-of-the-seat roller coaster ride through the twists and turns of transition, dizzying highs of successful surgeries and terrifying low of failed surgery, until finally through hormones and surgeries Dhillon's body is complete and he is at last the man he knew that he had the potential to be. Highly recommended especially for readers contemplating surgical options in transition. \square



ising a man or woman to change their sex." Iran now has one of the world's largest populations of trans, and the fatwa itself has become the stuff of legend. "All the restrictions that women in Iran are subject to applied to me," says Milad, born Mahboubeh. "I wasn't allowed to go out, let alone consult a doctor about my problems, and of course I had to wear the veil in public. I used to hide boy's clothes in my satchel to play with the kids in the street after school. First I saw a state doctor and then, for a year and a half, I was passed between experts and psychiatrists. I was given hundreds of tests, a brain scan. In the end, a clerical judge gave permission for my operation. My family threw me out. I drove a taxi from six in the morning to midnight. The rest of the time I slept in my car." The procedure took years and cost thousands of pounds, skin grafts, nerve grafts, muscle grafts - he has had 23 operations in three years and will have the last one before the end of the year. "My surgeon, Dr Khatir, has done such a good job that soon a woman won't notice a thing," he says. "He is a pioneer. He was doing this before the revolution. I am the only person in Iran, and perhaps in the world, to have gone as far, medically speaking. The last operation was the hardest..." Two bouts of four hours at a time on the operating table; his friends crying in the corridor, him thinking he was dying, saying his final prayers, a scarf clamped between his teeth to stop him screaming, and which he only took out to tell Dr Khatir, "Go on, I'd rather die than stay a woman." Milad still saves all his money to spend on removing his unwanted femininity. "My birth certificate, my identity card and my driving licence were changed when I stopped being a woman, in 2001. For the deep voice, the build, the beard, there are the hormones. I'll be taking them all my life. When I've finished all the operations and I have enough money, I'll think about marriage."(Mangez, C. 13 November 2005 Iran's trans revolution. Independent News)

Amin, 28, formerly Milad's best friend at school, has also undergone a sex-change operation, at age 25. He is a respected member of the Guardians of the Revolution, who do not know his former identity. "Since my two sisters learnt that, under sharia law, as the only male heir of the family I was entitled to twice their share of the inheritance, they have refused to see me." But legal recognition is not the same as social acceptance. Transexuals in Iran continue to suffer not just ostracism, but physical attacks. Iran's Muslim clerics discussed the issue at a conference in Tehran in June that drew officials from other Persian Gulf countries. One cleric, Muhammad Mehdi Kariminia, is writing his thesis on trans at the religious seminary of Qum. So far, Amir has spent \$12,000 on medical procedures. Dr. Bahram Mir-djalali, one of Tehran's few reassignment surgeons, said he had to fight on many fronts to help more than 200 patients who had consulted him in the 12 years he had performed operations. The majority of applicants for sex reassignment surgery are FTM. The first HK SRS operation was in 1981. In 1986 a Gender Identity Team of psychiatrist, clinical psychologist, gynecologist, endocrinologist, urologist, medical social worker and lawyer, was established in the Sex Clinic. A private sex clinic manned by a senior psychiatrist was also launched in 1995. Government financed SRS is available to those judged as suitable assessed through psychiatric evaluation, counseling and real-life test. A group called Civil Rights for Sexual Diversities (CR4SD) is working for change. After sex reassignment surgery, FTMs can change their name by deed poll at a District Administration Office. However, the name on one's birth certificate stays the same (and cannot be altered). The Immigration Department will change his identity card if he has sex reassignment surgery. A medical certificate and a sworn statement are required. A new identity card will be issued, showing new first name, sex ("M") and photograph. However, a "B" is included after the identity number, to note the fact that the ID card is different from his birth certificate. After receiving a new ID card, FTMs can change driving licence, credit cards and bank accounts. Hong Kong law provides protection against discrimination and harassment in employment on the grounds of disability for the purposes of the Disability Discrimination Ordinance. Once an FTM has received a new identity card, he or she can apply for a replacement Hong Kong SAR passport. It is not possible for FTMs to marry in Hong Kong. On entering into a new insurance contract after sex reassignment, a TS must disclose his previous sex. (Ma, J.L.C. (1999).

Kobe, Japan In a rare move, a 7-year-old diagnosed as suffering a gender identity disorder has been enrolled in a public elementary school in Hyogo Prefecture. The child underwent an examination at an Osaka hospital where an expert officially diagnosed him as suffering a gender identity disorder. The parents then submitted a medical certificate recognizing the child as a patient with a gender identity disorder to the school. TOKYO -- Takafumi Fujio is a typical, middle-aged salaryman. But until four years ago, when the food company worker started on a range of hormonal treatments, he was a woman, a housewife and mother of two. Fujio is one of an estimated 10,000 Japanese trans. Japan's first sex-change operation was performed in 1998, and its first trans politicians were elected to public office in 2003. A groundbreak-

ing legal reform allowing some transs to change their officially registered sex took effect the following year.

"These changes have been way overdue," Fujio said at a recent interview in Tokyo. "I think the law got people thinking, 'If the country has recognized these people, they must be acceptable after all."

"The transsexual community had a great dilemma.

If we spoke out, we risked our jobs, our livelihoods. But by staying silent, nothing would change," said Aya Kamikawa, Japan's first trans politician. Since 2003, Kamikawa has played a key role in lobbying for changes at both the national and local levels, including the sex-change law. She has also successfully lobbied to eliminate unnecessary mentions of gender in public documents.

Under the 2004 law, only unmarried, childless applicants can change their official gender. Applicants also must have had a sex-change operation and been diagnosed by two doctors as having so-called gender-identity disorder. A mere 151 people in Japan officially changed their sex when the law went into force. Fujio himself isn't eligible to change his official sex because he has children. His exhusband's family has allowed him to see his children only once since the divorce four years ago.

"Of course it's tough. We have to first get the public to think, `It's OK to live that way of life," he said. "Then, maybe I'll get to see my kids -- maybe in 10 years." South Korea -- Thursday's milestone Supreme Court ruling allowing a female-to-male transsexual to legally change gender on the family registration record is expected to bring many changes in laws and regulations. Trans who are permitted to change gender on family registration records can change their resident registration numbers. The 13digit number starts with "1" for men, and with "2" for women. Korea - Prof. Kim Seok-kwun of Dong-A University's College of Medicine in Busan has some 220 gender reassignment operations under his belt and is Korea's leading authority in the field. In the wake of the Supreme Court's decision that transsexuals can change their official sex in the Family Register, the Chosun Ilbo asked the professor's opinion. - You are a Christian. Have you ever thought that changing sex the God gave goes against Christian doctrine? "A minister in my church at first opposed my performing sex change operations. But God does not always create normal people. Some are born with six fingers or a harelip. I think treating those with problems with their gender identity is the same as doctors treating those born with deformity so they can have a normal life. The Malaysian term for FTM is Pak nyah (pak=father), also called abang (brother man) and tomboy. Four genders in Islam: male, female, khunsa (hermaphrodite) and mukhannis (cross-gender identity) / mukhannas (cross-gender behaviour only). Islam intolerant towards cross-gender behaviours and identity. While a khunsa can take action in relation to his condition, the mukhannis or mukhannas is forbidden to. In Malaysia cross-dressing is illegal. The Hadith in Sahih Bukhari, Volume 7, Book72, Number 774, states that: Narrated Ibn 'Abbas: The Prophet cursed effeminate men and those women who assume the manners of men, and he said, "Turn them out of your houses." The Hadith in Sunan Abu-Dawud, Book 32, Number 4087, states that: Narrated Abu Hurayrah: The Apostle of Allah cursed the man who dressed like a woman and the woman who dressed like a man. Trans who want to add a new name of the opposite sex to their original name must prove that they have undergone a sex change operation. They must get a letter from a doctor in a government hospital to certify that they have undergone the operation. Letters from private hospitals or clinics will not be acceptable.

Malaysia I feel that as a researcher in this area, I should speak out. As a researcher, there is already enough scientific research in the area of transsexualism to convince my colleagues and I that transsexualism refers to a biological phenomenon. This research is published in reputable journals as well as on the Internet. The debate on this issue goes on because people, especially those in authority, refuse to accept these scientific findings.

MCA's Wanita chief Dr Ng Yen Yen did speak as a medical doctor once in support of transsexuals' rights sometime back because she is aware of these scientific research. My research on 507 transsexuals in 2001, which has been peered reviewed internationally and accepted by the international academic community, shows transsexuals start feeling different at a very young age, some as young as four or five years old. They have both brothers and sisters as their role models. Concerning religion, I have spoken to an ustaz at Jakim (Jabatan Kemajuan Islam) and he said that if transsexualism is a biological factor, then Islam will have to reinterpret the matter. In Iran, the government has




