RESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Another eventful year rolls around again. FPE continues to grow--every week there is a package of applications going back to Fran. Little by little we are finding more people close enough together to make little groups and coming together to make new Chapters. Sally in Houston has finally got a respectable group going in south Texas and a group is forming in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area; enough girls found themselves near enough together in Indiana to make their own little group there; Phoenix has a small group; Oklahoma City-Tulsa, St. Louis and Philadelphia-East Pennsylvania are also in the organizing process. So we have lots of groups around the country.

Our affiliate groups in Sweden, Denmark and England are also going strong. Although most of the credit goes to the councillors and leaders of those groups, particularly, Annette in Sweden, Erna in Denmark and Pamela, Alga and Sylvia in England, it pleases me to know that my own efforts in these three countries during my trip last August helped to bring a number of lost souls out of the woodwork and into the sunlight of friendship and acceptance. So we grow and that is good.

Although most of our growth in the U.S. is due to my efforts to expose myself on radio and television so that I can be "found" and thus TVia also, as well as advertising that has been done for Chevalier, it is timely to mention with appreciation the efforts of other individuals and groups who have run ads in various newspapers seeking to find more persons in their areas. Particularly to me mentioned and thanked in this regard are the groups in the Bay area of California (Alpha Epsilon), Boston's Gamma Chapter, Baltimore's Rho Chapter and the group in Phoenix. Their efforts have brought many new sisters into the open, thus enlarging the individual lives and the local group's eventual membership. Individuals and groups who have not done this might well consider doing so and thus paying back to others some of the help, enlightenment and friendship they have received. Any newspaper that has a personal column is worth a try, even little neighborhood throwaway advertising publications. Be sure and use the word heterosexual and give Chevalier's address with the first three numerals of your zip code as a department. This gives us an idea where the new inquiries come from.

It is not only fair, but timely to point out that part of our growth (starting as TVia membership) is due to the nature of our current society, as well as our own searchings. We all know that we are living in a much more permissive society than we were just a short ten years ago when TVia began publication and eight years ago when FPE was founded. Literature, movies, clothing and hair styles, and many other things that are commonplace today would have been impossible just these few years ago. We are moving fast and this is to the general good I'm sure, but there are a couple of factors that we need to think a little more about.....security and responsibility.

When there were restrictive laws governing public dressing (there still are in some places), when the post office was awfully up-tight about all kinds of things going through the mail, and in general, when society was much less tolerant than it is today, we all minded our P's and Q's pretty carefully. We were careful where we went, whom we met, and what and to whom we wrote because we could see some sort of social penalty looming over us should we get careless. But today much of this has changed and many TV's have changed with it. By this I mean they have become much more free and easy about their own lives, but unfortunately they sometimes become equally carefree and careless about the lives of others. Sometimes I'm led to think that my own concern about the security of the rest

of you (whether FPE's or just TVia readers) is not only unnecessary, but often unappreciated as a barrier to "progress". Maybe I'm not "with it"; maybe old Auntie Virginia is becoming an anachronism like ankle length skirts--relatively Victorian that is.

There are several other collections of TV's in the country besides those of you who belong to FPE. I say "collections" because they are affiliated and gathered around some publication, but they are not really organized in a cohesive group as we are. Some of those who read these lines belong to one or another of these collections as well as to FPE. This is their privilege and right and it is understandable since we all seek for contacts with others. I don't put those of you who maintain such double loyalties down for doing so. But certain events have come to my attention which make me feel that I should say a few words on this matter.

All of you who have joined FPE, signed a pledge not only acknowledging your own interest in cross-dressing, but promising to respect the security of others such as not giving out names, addresses or phone numbers which have been given to you to third parties. The security arrangements of our sorority were designed in such a way that not only did you put yourself on record, promise to respect security of others and were interviewed (except the very first members), but were given to understand that everyone else had received the same treatment. Thus you could feel safe with them while they could feel safe with you whether they were in your own home group or elsewhere. The fellowship (should be "girl-ship") that you were offered was the reward or benefit secured by going through our procedures.

Unfortunately some of our members, either do not think about or do not understand the purpose of our security arrangements. When non-FPE members are put in contact with those who are members, it is quite likely that some common ground and compatibility will be discovered and an exchange of names, addresses and phone numbers follows. The outsider now has a contact, the benefit of the friendship (whether in person or by mail) of the FPE member and this generally widens in a short time to others. She is therefore soon in position of enjoying most of the benefits of membership without ever having committed herself in any way. Other people meeting her will have no way of knowing that she hasn't "gone the route" too and may extend confidences without realizing that she has never given her word to anyone about respecting such confidences. This is why it is really unfair and against security policy to mix members with non-members. If the new one is a fine person, encourage her to go through the same procedure that you went through so that we can all be on the same level.

Another matter of some concern is that these other groups exert no security control at all over who may advertise and answer ads except that they be members of the association. Membership is also uncontrolled. If you can pay the fee, you are in and can advertise and reply to ads. Thus, the type of person whose ad you may be answering may be a far cry from your own type, may be involved directly or at second hand with some activity that the Post Office takes a dim view of (they are by no means inactive--the conservative faction of both local and national government would like nothing better than to liquidate the "permissive" society and go back to the "good" old days when all kinds of things were restricted and penalized.) If the P.O. is on to a person that you are writing to, your return address will be noted and when they descend on him, they may well descend on you too!

Apart from this risk, the policy I have always followed of never giving one persons information to another but requiring them to do it themselves is apparently not the case in these other gatherings. For example, I know of two cases where phone numbers were given out and persons called the homes of others asking for them by femme names or commenting on "how pretty you looked in that pink dress in the photo". Both of these messages were received by GG's and considerable confusion and embarrassment resulted for the TV in question. This is the area where I apply the word responsibility. I feel that the person in my position, who has access to personal data has the responsibility to keep it inviolate and unrevealed. But I also feel that anyone who gets such information from another person about a third person also has a responsibility not to use it in such thoughtless ways.

So, I can close by reminding and requesting those of you who have taken out memberships in other groups beside FPE that in faithfulness to your FPE pledge and fairness to your sisters in FPE, that you DO NOT MIX THE TWO. Your sisters in FPE have a right to expect that you will honor and abide by FPE policies in all matters pertaining to FPE and its other members. What you do in addition is your own business, but remember that FPE exists on mutual faith and trust and all its members must both have it and extend it. So while some may consider FPE a bit old fashioned and restrictive in this new era, there are many others that have relied on the security policies which govern FPE and in fact, would not be in it were it not for those policies. So, although you may be younger, or have much less to lose, less of an investment in your life (both materially and reputationally) than one of the other girls and thus may be inclined to be a little more free wheeling in your dealings with other people, remember that you did take the pledge of membership like all the others. Honor it and be considerate of your sisters inside the sorority whatever your attitude and activities outside it may be.

With that I'll say goodbye to you for this year's report and hope that you will all realize that my concern for security and responsibility is nothing that benefits me in any way, but that I feel that I have made a tacit contract with each of you when you entered FPE to be on my toes regarding all matters affecting your safety and well-being. When I consider the great changes that have taken place in public attitudes in the last few years, I feel that a word of caution is necessary to sort of tie down some of these that may have a tendency to get swept away by the tide of freedom, optimism, and unconcern that is presently sweeping over our society. Mind you, I'm not against that when it becomes a generally accepted pattern for all of us, but in this interim period of change I think that perhaps these words of reminder are in order.

REGIONAL INTERVIEWERS

At least once a year, if not much more often, we should pay tribute to the wonderful gals who act as our Regional Interviewers. These people have contributed a great deal to the growth of FPE and under the new regional system that was announced in 1968, we have become much more effective. We now manage to get to more new members much faster than even before and try our best to get them off to a good start in FPE. The job of Interviewer is most important and a very responsible position to be in. She must first set up an address for receiving mail and wait for a letter of introduction to arrive from the new member.

Then she must correspond with the new member and try to find a convenient time and place to meet for the interview. Our interviewers do not get paid for the time or travel expense which can amount to a considerable amount of money in a years time. When the interview is arranged, the interviewer has the difficult task of making the final decision as to whether the new member is really an FP and sometimes this isn't easy to find out. She must help to make the new person feel at ease so they can have a discussion and exchange points of view as well as answer many questions. The Interviewer must ask enough questions, without prying too much into the personal and occupational status of the interviewee and, from all of this information, reach a decision. Finally, she must always use extreme empathy and understanding because she may be on a much more advanced level of FP development and cannot forget those emotions that she experienced in her own early days. When the interview is over, she must report back to the Executive Secretary her findings and then present, in most cases, the membership card to the new member which means she has been accepted for full membership. So, in this annual report, we should all extend our appreciation to the many gals who represent FPE directly for the first time and help to safeguard the security of us all. Thank you ladies for your efforts on behalf of FPe and its members.

We have added ten new Interviewers this past year and are still looking for additional people to fill the geographical gaps that exist. So, if you feel that you are qualified to fill the above qualifications and there is not an interviewer in your reasonably close area, please contact us and we will be happy to consider you.

There are regular meetings now in both Sweden and Denmark. Two annual big meetings for all Scandinavia in both Stockholm and Copenhagen. Two annual long weekends in an all hired hotel in South Sweden for all Scandinavia. Monthly meetings are being held in Copenhagen. An Open House for members in Stockholm is held one night each week.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT (OR "Tell It Like It Is")

Lots of things have happened this past fiscal year and some are good and some are bad. First the good things. Our membership grew in total to 361 members. We enrolled 107 new members, which is 7 more than last year...at least a modest gain. We have over 40 pending applications for membership in our files of which most should eventually be enrolled. The total time for processing a new member and getting her enrolled is about two months, so we are always behind in this process. I believe that we are getting the interview set up and completed faster now, at least in most cases. However, in some regions our Interviewers are overworked, so additional help is needed.

Financially, as you will see by the report, we operated in the black once again, the fourth year in a row. But also as you can see, our income was down considerably. More on this later! Our expenses were about the same as last year. We cut down on our Public Relations budget and in some other areas, but our regular expenses of administration went up due to larger membership. We were over 400 at one point, and costs in general went up.

Chapter wise, we only had one application for a new chapter in that Omega Iota applied recently. But we feel that most of the chapters did make good progress in stability and maturity. The fact is that in making the transition to our new regional system, we counted many former geographical areas as chapters and they never developed. So in truth, we have more active chapters now than in the past. One step we are taking here is to send out a petition for chapter status to all of the active groups as well as established chapters so that we can really determine who is doing what in what area. The petitions will be mailed with the Annual Report and we will hope to have a very active report for you on "Chapters" in the Fall.

Our International affiliates continue to grow rapidly and we added a new one this past year in Mexico. Northern Europe and England (Beaumont Society) boast of around 100 members each, so they are moving along very well. We now have sufficient members in the Far East to have them become an affiliate, although they are spread over great distances. We also placed our members in Africa into the Beaumont Society because they have stronger ties with our English friends. So, if Europe proper and South America would develop, we would have excellent world-wide affiliates to work with; but as it is, our present affiliates have done an excellent job. (See Erna's Report)

Administration wise, we continue to do our best to serve you in every way that we can. There are delays, of course, and lots of projects never really developed and completed. One project that is nearly completed is the New Member Guide Booklet which we hope to have out by the Fall issue of the Forum. We will probably mail it to all current members and then, of course, send one along with each new member's enrollment material in the future. It's a big job, however, and takes time that we barely can scrape together. We also hope to make some changes in the Femme Forum as money and contributed ideas will allow. We will probably go to larger envelopes if the cost isn't too great to save folding and give you a less wrinkled newsletter. Other projects to benefit you all are planned, but we won't put our foot in our mouths until they are ready and we can afford them.

We mentioned some "bad things" above and please believe me when I say I wish we didn't have to bring these to your attention at all. But let's be honest, ladies, we need your ideas and support to solve them. First of all, as you might expect, the dues situation is really bad in that we have had to drop over 100 members this year because they didn't pay their dues. I hate this subject as much as you do, and consider it my biggest problem as your Executive Secretary by a long margin. This year we sent out an additional final notice in place of the May issue of the Forum to those who had not paid and this one, added to the previous two individual notices, as well as the general notice in the November and January issues of the Forum, makes five in all. We sent return envelopes three times for the convenience of the members, but had little response. So, I have spent countless hours over a 9 month period (November to July) trying to get these people to pay up with only moderate success.

The real problem is not only the wasted time and loss of income, but the fact that most of these "non-pays" are still around and very active in local FPE activities. This to me is disgusting, because it means that they continue to reap the benefits of friendship and contacting others, but you the paid members must pay their way. I really can't understand how you continue to condone this and or ignore this problem. Thus, we are taking some steps on our part at national level to correct things and along with our steps, we ask that you cooperate and support us in an effort to clean this mess up. First of all, a Chapter Petition is going out to all groups and when it is returned, we will cross check to see who is on the chapter list and not currently in good standing in FPE. We will also ask for an annual report of chapter members and return it to the chapters so that the officers will know what is going on in their groups. Secondly, we are asking that FPE membership cards be shown at all meetings so that those present will know who is and who isn't paid and current with FPE. We go to great lengths every year to print new membership cards (new colors and the year stated on the card) and send them out to the paid members; yet few if anyone ever asks to see these cards at a meeting. Thus, we ask that you all comply with this rule and if the member doesn't have a current card that you ask her to pay her national dues or not attend any further meetings. Other than these steps, we implore you all to help us police up our organization in this area so we can all go on to bigger and better things on a positive note. Thank you so much!!

The other area of considerable problem is security, particularly on the chapter level. Virginia has touched on this many times, but we continue to get reports that non-members are attending meetings and as in the case of the non-pays, enjoying the benefits we have all worked hard for. How can you possibly expose all of your FPE friends to someone that we have absolutely no recourse with in case he or she decides to foul everything up? We have all completed applications and paid our money and been properly interviewed and then we open up everything dear to us to strangers or people who we really know nothing about. Security is everyone's job and we must ask that we all help to maintain our rules in the strictest sense at all times. We all have everything to lose and nothing to gain by our reckless attention to security rules, yet problems continue to happen. Thus, we will have to not only ask for your cooperation along these lines, but will be forced to start taking strong measures such as booting out entire groups where attention to security continues to exist. I am sure that we can work together in these areas and sincerely hope that you all realize that security is for your own good and you all have a responsibility to the other members of FPE. Please remember if the former member or non-member isn't on the active list, doesn't have a current membership card, or isn't newly enrolled, she doesn't belong in your group. So let's have "PROJECT CLEAN-UP" in 1971 and then maintain control and attention to these important matters. Thank you!

NATIONAL CHAIRLADIES

Sheila Niles, 30 B-2, has contributed a great deal to the area of chapter development this past year. She and her GG have visited many chapters and potential chapters in her capacity of Director of Chapter Development. Sheila is also our Social News Editor and always comes up with interesting reports on the various groups as well as her insight on reporting on other areas of news. So, please continue to submit your chapter news (in sufficient time for Sheila to edit it and get it to the Executive Secretary). These news items should be sent directly to Sheila and no later than the 20th of the month preceding the printing of the Forum. Ann 10 M-2 has come up with lots of good ideas as Public Relations Chairman and anyone needing ideas can write to Ann direct or send a letter via Fran 49 C-1, Box 36091. She has done everything from getting her hair fixed in a beauty salon, taking the opportunity to convert everyone present to the FP concept, to parading with a sign at the Mardi Gras in in New Orleans. Ann will try any worthy idea out and has some excellent thoughts for you, so contact her.

Jeri Kaye, 49 K-3, our renowned literary editor and chairman completed another fine years work. She has kept up on most areas of TV interest and probably saved our members thousands of dollars which would have been wasted on trashy-type books which have only a small segment or no true TV value at all.
