

FEDERAL COURT DISCRIMINATE AGAINST INMATES

Dear DFA Friend:


You are probably aware that we have been mounting a campaign against the injustice inmates at the United State Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Missouri ("USMCFP") are experiencing when attempting to seek redress of constitutional deprivations in the local federal court. USMCFP-Springfield is the Bureau of Prisons flagship hospital for federal prisoners' health care. The institution has been tagged a "death camp" by prisoners, activists and legal organizations. Its housing of mental, medical and general inmates has created a chaotic and detrimental institutional setting. The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) condemned USMCFP-Springfield for violating virtually every one of revolving medical standards and prompted Congress to conduct hearings about the often fatal health care provided federal prisoners.

The inadequate medical treatment, unorthodox practices, substandard and often medically dangerous health care at USMCFP-Springfield has proliferated at least partly as a result of the local federal court dismissing inmates' complaints out-of-hand and utilizing the extinct "hands-off" theory -- that is, showing preference for prisoncrat policies. In other districts, inmates court filings exhort against constitutional infringements. However, the procedures and rulings of the federal district court in Springfield ratify the brutal and dehumanizing conditions at the Medical Center. The courts failure to consider inmates complaints for excessive periods of time and other unjust procedures vitiates the most basic legal standards set forth by the U.S. Supreme Court.

The attached letters are addressed to members of the judiciary which oversees the federal district court -- that is, U.S. District Court, Western District of Missouri, Southern Division, sitting at Springfield.
