## Pamella's ${ }^{\text {Sex }}$ Switch Imperfect

STANFORD - "The first time I went out on the street dressed as a woman - my God, it was terrifying," recalls Pamella Bratton.
"People weren't stopping because the traffic lights were red. They were staring at me."

The time was May of 1372, when five months of estrogen therapy leading to a sex-change operation had put a woman's curves on a man's 5 -font-10 frame.

Ralph Taylor Rralton, whose name three months later was rehanged in court to Pamella Bratton, also begąn electrolysis treatments to remove his beard. Estrogen therapy could not reverse that Irail.
Since that time Pamella Bratton has practiced the role of a woman while awaitIng the final physiological adjustment done by a surgical team at Stanford liniversitv.
Inemployed for several munths despite extensive silpervisnry and fechnicals skjlls. she still awaits an econmomir hreak that will ninv ide the $\$ 2.50 \mathrm{n}$ needed to complete the treatment.
In the meantime the role playing has its ha\%ards. She could not complete the electrolysis hecause she did not have the money. "and a shadow of a heard is appear ing and I get terrible nervous.

Pamella experienced a "Inwering of the libido," a calmness and reduction of drive, when the estrogen the: apy hesan. But even now she "comes on slrong" to make a point -- an aggressive rather than passive reaction.
"I really don't think I have In holster my femininity. I consitier muself asexual at this lime. I do think yoll can totally suppress sex drives."
Emotionally, "I don't find muself attracted to all men -- only certain men, someone who is secure in his identity, who doesn't have to put up a line.'

Pamella maintains that Ralph never was attracted to men for homosexual activities, and that transsexilals typically are not intreested in getiing involved with homosexuals.
She tritures a photo copy of legal detmumons, in lact. In perily that trans-sextrals are clearly different from hnmo-
reins doesn't begin he ex plains, doesn't begin as part of the sex drive that comes with puberty as do homosex wal tendencies or the urge to dress like a woman.
"Homosexuality is a sexual disorder." she declares. "It's an attraction between two people of the same gender, who are aware of their gen der and happy with it, who have a nuptial relationship.
"The transvestite almost always is male and aware of his gender. I don't believe he desires to change his gender but only to dress in the opposite gender.'
In contrast. transsexualism manifests itself when a child is 3 to 6 years old. "It's the belief one is on the opposile sex: the mor phongical appearance of one gender and self-identity with the opposite sender."
What sexual activilies Ralph had -. and they ne curred rarely. perhaps once or Iwice a year - were with women.
"rrine in my estrosen therapy. I could have rela linns with a female if she epilnmized everything I wanled in he. Then I would 'become' the female."

Once the estrogen treatments hegan. any ability to perform as a man disappeared.

Pamella still wears pants-but for new curves


One of the chief obstacles o ptaying the role of a woman for Pamella is more than 36 years of facing the world as a man.
"It"s easy if you've never nad an identity. But if you've rad a male identity and you're slarting from scratch, it isn't easy. I don't know what's expected of me as a 38-year-old person.
"I don't. want in look 38 and I don't Seel 38. 1 don't
want in have a more youthful appearance. A lot of other trans-sexuals go in a lnt of extremes to make them selves look more youthful,' she reports.
"Homosexual, heterosexual. trans-sexual - none of us has an honest opinion of what we look like. We cop out to the mirror on what we want in be."
But the differencer for rans-sexuals is that they al ready have suhmilled in drastic physical eh añes hrough surgery. So ensimetic ardjustments such as lacelifiing or breast implantation seem routine and pasily rlone hy comparison
During this interim periort awaiting the crucial npera tion. Pamella savs she has hecome very pensive. She no tices Ihings Ralph wnuld have overlonked in the past and has started to write
