Davis, who grew out of the bowels of the Watts Projects took her name after the militant 60s leftist Angela Davis and raged through the punk rock DIY culture of the late 70s. She's honed her stage skills as a performer in numerous musical groups including the speed metal thrash band Pedro, Muriel and Ester, the funkified gospel drag spectacular The Afro Sisters and is currently the lead singer of !Cholita!, a twisted eight piece "all female" version of the Latin pop group Menudo.

Davis is widely known for her outrageous, gender bending performances in nightclubs, galleries, colleges and universities as well as on film and videotape. Most recently she appeared in Ruby Wax's "Ruby Takes You There" for the BBC and played the part of Luscious Loreli in Armstead Maupin's "Tales of the City" for PBS. She is the editor of the widely circulated cult zines Fertile LaToya Jackson and Shrimp.
