CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPATION

In the following conditions the term: (a) "institute" refers to Fantasia Fair Ltd.; (b) "participant" refers to the crossdresser (TV, TP, DRAG, TS, or TG) applying to attend the Fair; (c) "partner" usually applies to the participant's spouse or significant other (M or F); (d) a "couple" consists of a participant and a partner; and, (e) "attendee" refers to participants, partners, and guests attending the Fair.

(1) Registration will be accepted from all persons who have reached their 18th birthday prior to 15 October 1990.

(2) Attendees are expected to maintain certain standards of at-

tire and deportment that are appropriate to individuals of any respectable group. If an attendee's behavior is deemed by the Fair Coordinator to be inappropriate, the Institute reserves the right to terminate that attendee's stay. Under such conditions the Institute will refund 50% of the charges, paid by the attendee, for the time remaining at the point of termination.

(3) The "deposit" of \$200/person or \$350/couple shall be treated as partial payment of the total due, as stated in this brochure, and by agreement between the Institute and paying attendee(s)

(4) All attendee(s) who have their accounts paid in full prior to July 1, 1990, will receive a discount of 5% of the total cost of the selected plan (exclusive of seminars, for fee activities, and workshops).

(5) Except in cases of late registration, all payments are due no later than September 15th, 1990. (If you are unable to pay by that date special arrangements can be made with the Coordinator.) If not paid the Institute reserves the right to cancel the reservation as per Condition 6b or 6c below, as applicable. (6) If a registration is cancelled, the Institute will make refunds according to the following schedule:

(a) Cancellation three months prior to the Fair will receive refund of all paid fees less \$60;

(b) Cancellation two months prior to the Fair will receive refund of all paid fees less "deposit"; and,

(c) Cancellations after 1 October will not be refunded.

BASIC PARTICIPANT PACKAGE (PART A)

Registration Fees (PART A) for the Nine-Day Fair covers the cost of the Fair provided housing (exclusive of tips for service); an Inn provided continental breakfast each morning; three house wine and cheese parties (or similar events as provided by the House Hostess/Host); a brunch each Sunday; five seminar lunches; five evening meals (including Apres Follies Buffet); and, free admission to all Fair sponsored major events open to the Public. (All Fair provided meals include tax & tips, but not beverage charges.) The Basic Participant Package (PART A) includes all programs, workshops, seminars, activities and events cited in this brochure except for those cited under Special Programs (PART B).



SPECIAL PROGRAMS (PART B)

Certain programs are of benefit to a select few and therefore are offered on an individual fee basis to keep the overall cost of the Fair down.

SPEECH IMPROVEMENT - Basic & Advanced Basic: (Fee \$100) A six hour workshop of small classroom instruction by an experienced qualified professional. Advanced: (Fee: \$135) Individualized instruction focused upon problem solving open only to students who have completed Basic Speech or upon approval of instructor.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT - Part I & II (Four Hours Each) The Personal Development Program consists of small group workshops conducted by an experienced qualified professional. Part I Workshop focuses upon the woman within and developing a positive self image. Part II Workshop helps to define this self image within interpersonal relationships. (Fee: \$50 per each part.)

KITE FLY PICNIC - An afternoon kite fly (kites furnished) and picnic. (Fee: \$25).

WHALE WATCH - An afternoon aboard ship to watch the great whales off the Cape. (Wear warm clothes.) (Fee \$35.)

SPECIAL GUEST SEMINAR - Each year we invite a particular helping professional working with the crossdressing community to present a topic of choice. (Fee: \$25) SPECIAL WORKSHOPS - Each year we invite professionals to present special workshops which will be announced as they are developed.

... IS SEMINARS

Fantasia Fair schedules eighteen seminars from which you select six. Historically the basic seminar meals are included in the Part A Basic Fair Package, however there may be a \$3/seminar fee in order to fix an exact number on who is attending a given seminar for meal planning purposes. *Indicates that the seminar topic is in planning and may be subject to change. Going Public A panel of experienced crossdressers explain the ins and outs of "going public" in Provincetown and elsewhere. They describe the do's & don'ts of presenting yourself both in terms of clothes and self image; what to do in troubled situations; and their own life experiences.

Partners () Speaker and Topic to be selected through consultation with partners returning to the Fair. In 1989 we had Dr. Peggy Rudd who wrote My Husband Wears My Clothes.

Legal Aspects Topic and discussion presented by a lawyer alternates between legal identity problems for the crossdresser in general; or, those of the transsexual. in general; or, those of the transsexual.

<u>TS Surgery</u> (Participants) An MD presents a detailed discus-

sion of the "state of the art" in transsexual surgery and the related "Standards of Care" Modeling A modeling school graduate/instructor presents

Lifestyles A panel discussion by various types of crossdressers presenting the advantages and disadvantages of

Sociological A professional presentation on a particular cross-cultural aspect of crossdressing. How do various societies view the crossdresser? What is a "berdache" Electrolysis A professional electrologist will present the do's and don't of selecting an electrologist and the various techniques used.

Health An MD will present guidelines for CDs as related to hormones and general health care. (We are negotiating for a screening physical for those interested as a separate workshop.)

The Photographic Model* A seminar of the art of photographic modeling. How to take self pictures, studio shots, modeling poses, and make-up hints for BW & color photographs.

On Stage, Live!* A presentation by a professional female impersonator on the art of female impersonation and how to put together an act.

SPECIAL SEMINAR (\$25) This special seminar involves a presentation by a professional who has contributed as a helping professional to the CD community. The topic is traditionally selected by the

<u>Town & Gown Supper/Program*</u> The Ladies of the

Fair prepare a church supper for the people of Provincetown followed by a panel of "town & gown" speakers discussing various aspects of lifestyle among CD's and Provincetown (the largest gay resort in the United States).

Fashion Show* The Ladies of the Fair present an array of fashion for the people of Cape Cod. If you ever wanted to see what it is like to be a fashion model, this is it!

Outreach Banquet The Human Achievement and Outreach Institute sponsors Fantasia Fair. As a participant you are an associate member of the Institute. This cocktail party and banquet is the Institute's way of saying "Thank you for your continuing support". Fan/Fair Follies* Fanfare! The Ladies of the Fair present for Cape Cod their Fifteenth Annual Review. If you sing, dance, play, perform magic tricks, have a comedy act, or want to work behind the curtain this is your chance to take part in the best amateur FI show in the country!

Fantasy Ball* Not for the meek at heart, this combination "Mardi Gras", "Halloween", and "Drag Contest" asks who are: Ms Provincetown; Mr & Ms Fantasy Ball; and Best Costume. It is time to don your most outrageous costume to compete with the "girls" of the Cape, and who knows where else.

The Awards Banquet Pile up your hair, do your best make-up learned at the Fair, put on your ball gown and join the Ladies of the Fair for the Awards Cocktail Party and Banquet. Be prepared for lots of hugs and kisses and carry a hankie just in case.



...IS ACTIVITIES

The Fair's activities are ever growing with new ones often announced mid-fair, and most just spontaneously organized to party, party, party! But, these are the basic activities built into our program.

Open House Cocktail Party On Friday, October 13th, we come as we are, whether we have unpacked or not, to a cash bar cocktail party to meet each other informally before we go out into the town for supper on our own. Just a casual tradition.

House Parties. Your House Hostess has a little kitty to throw three "wine and cheese" parties, usually one on each Saturday and one on Wednesday. This "pajama party" can be a night out on the town with the girls at the inn, or maybe a combination party with another house. Its up to the house!

Sunday Brunch Each Sunday, before church, or during church (naughty naughty sleepyheads) we gather for brunch to share.

Church The Universalist Meeting House has served as our church for years as we share this beautiful experience with our dear friends in Provincetown. Whale Watch (\$35 Special Fee) Dress up warm and board ship to journey out into the deep where the whale pods frolic. Last year a proud mamma actually picked her baby out of the water in her mouth to show us how pretty baby was!

Kite Fly Picnic (\$25 Special Fee) On Friday afternoon we don our warm clothes and high heels to go fly our kite while enjoying the afternoon and our late picnic lunch.

Video Party After the Fantasy Ball we get together to look at the video out-takes from the Fashion & Beauty Course, the Fashion Show, and the Fan/Fair Follies.



...IS WORKSHOPS

This year we are expanding our workshops. *Indicates a workshop in negotiation or planning.

Fashion And Beauty Course (Included in Basic Package) Every facet is documented in this group of classes and workshops. The typical schedule for this workshop is: (a) "Being Terrific" Student analysis of needs;

(b) "Pretty Face I" Skin care, beard cover, eyebrows, foundation and contouring; (c) "Dynamic Woman I" Video of student body movement,

Color And Image Workshop* (\$175)

The technique of mix and match combined with the art of wardrobe planning. PERSONAL HEALTH WORKSHOP* (Price to be determined.) This workshop will be in conjuction with a medical center and our own MD's. Crossdressers, such as transsexuals, often develop physical problems because of their use of hormones, electrolysis, etc. This leads to a natural shyness about physical examinations and laboratory examinations which could be life saving if done in time. This individualized workshop includes a complete basic physical and related blood tests as well as medical consultation about personal plans.

Partners Program (Included in Basic Package) This program, under the guidance of returning partners, consists of an Orientation Session, Partner Seminar, and daily morning coffee calls with guests. In past years the Partner's group has developed a brochure for partners of CDs which may be obtained by writing to our Fair address.

__IS LIVING TOGETHER

Fantasia Fair is a residential fair based in downtown Provincetown, and not isolated in standard motels built a mile or more from the center of this charming rustic seaport & artists colony. Instead, it is deliberately designed to: (a) get our ladies out and about town by separating housing facilities from meals and programs; (b) release the woman within from any "closets" so that she may experience a touch of reality in a friendly community; (c) provide a smorgasbord of programs. workshops, seminars, events, and activities so that you can plan YOUR Fantasia Fair; and, (d) provide Inns designed to serve as a supportive small group "sorority house" environment where our ladies can share their experiences while being helped by experienced House Hostesses, who have attended two or more Fairs.

We have carefully selected small classic New England Inns to provide our participants easy access to the town's fine restaurants and shops as well as the Fair. Host Inns are chosen for two basic traits: (1) Comfort; and, (2) An Innkeeper and Staff which actively want to have us as their guests. Our best way to judge an Inn is by the fact that a significant number of our ladies sign up to return to an Inn or Apartment year after year.



...IS FOR CONFIDENCE

Fantasia Fair is designed to help the crossdresser feel comfortable living in the opposite gender role. Novices and those suppressing their femme self are urged to express and enjoy their alternative role, without fear, in a secure and understanding environment. Experienced crossdressers enjoy meeting and sharing their experience with the novice, thus making new friendships and gaining insight into themselves.

Those contemplating a permanent change will gain additional knowledge concerning their choice. Many helping professionals recommend our program as a must for their beginning transsexual clients.

Learning to cope with situations and emotions increases understanding of ourselves and relations with others. Our self image begins to improve. As the Fair comes to a close, participants have developed new friendships and achieved a new plateau of personal growth. The Fair offers an interwoven program of practical, social and educational experiences, for the novice and advanced crossdresser.

There are daily workshops devoted to various aspects of personal grooming and feminine expression. Emphasis is given to makeup skills as well as wig and hairstyling for all occasions. Experts in fashion discuss wardrobe selection, style and color coordination. In essence the Fair offers to all participants an opportunity to complete a Basic Fashion Modeling and Charm Course. There are dynamic programs in feminine body language and vocal skills. Private sessions in these areas can be arranged with professional consultants.

Several seminars are offered that address important issues. The legalities of crossdressing, pertinent medical, psychological and sociological issues, and the dynamics of social interaction are explored. Each seminar is presented by acknowledged professionals in their respective fields.

The personal growth workshops provide an opportunity for participant to search the inner self and gain a more positive attitude about crossdressing behavior. A workshop is especially offered for couples. It has been developed to provide support, and a better understanding of crossdressing behaviors. It is facilitated by an experienced counselor.
