I am writing to introduce myself. I was recently elected President of the Seahorse Club- Victoria.

I understand from Jocelyn [REDACTED], Immediate Past President, that you are familiar with the club. It was, in fact, Jocelyn who gave me your address.

To the best of our knowledge, the Victorian club is the only active club in Australia at the present time.

The Seahorse club in Australia has been organised on a state basis for some years. Attempts were made some 4 or 5 years ago to form a national body to act in a co-ordinating role. But these attempts failed. It proved difficult to maintain personal contact with bodies based hundreds of kilometres apart. It also appears that the enthusiasm of some of the early executive members wained. Some loose contact is maintained by some interstate members on a personal basis.

I would be interested in joining your group as an overseas affiliate. I have read some past Beaumont bulletins (1976/78) I am thus aware somewhat of the structure of your organisation- at least as it applied at that time.

I am married with 2 children and live at Ballarat some 120 k west of Melbourne where the club is based.
