And the minor crisis of Winnie's retirement was a minor crisis because there are those of us to take over Winnie's position as president, secretary, treasurer and den mother. These duties are now divided among four people! Winnie is doing well so any crisis status in her life is past.

At a recent house party, a friend of nonmember status (so far) remarked that he was impressed with the level of comradery among us. He had attended two house parties. Two parties in our honor at J.D.'s, a dinner & theater party, and a few other events.

The monthly house parties are new, and this is in the middle of the summer when organizational things sometimes halt for the summer and may or may not restart!

We are also in a dialog with Senator Tom Duane, an openly gay N.Y. State legislator fighting for OUR rights inclusive with the gay rights struggle. A number of us have sent him documentation of our problems with straight and sometimes very narrow-minded society.

News of our progress with these and any other activities will be posted in our monthly newsletter and TGIC on line.

I take no credit for this. It's happening because involved members are making it happen, not just me. Conversely, if TGIC falls apart, I take the heat. Do I have an agenda? No. The agenda has taken formation on it's own from our combined efforts and input. It ain't broke so it don't need fixing.

There IS a club charter and by-laws. I've actually seen it and looked it over! We are not following it exactly but I don't perceive that as broke either.

Very recently, a member brought up the fact that the presently involved regulars, including five of the seven officers are predominantly TS's, TS candidates or full-time, life committed crossgender people like myself. We make decisions and plan parties and meetings while the closet renters who are

not TS's, often with security concerns, are the ones keeping the clubhouse afloat financially. For those people, the monthly third Saturday meetings at Yours are still happening. This is the group that was formerly the Lambda-Chi-Lambda chapter of Tri-Ess originally organized by Sharon Ann Stewart. These meetings have a more even mix of TV's and TS's. If that's not enough, COMMUNICATE WITH US. I just learned that at one time in the past (before my involvement) our group had split into TVIC/TGIC to address and serve both groups more efficiently. Maybe the ex LCL may become a new TVIC or some such. It's a possible option.

What did I not cover? F-M people? They are always welcome. Evan did attend Vicky's party. The F-M transgender phenomenon manifests itself differently from the M-F phenomena. We're Yang becoming Yin; they are Yin becoming Yang, a different transition in a different direction from a different starting place. They <u>are</u> organizing for themselves <u>and</u> they are welcome here.

That's it. Responses pro and con are welcome.



# **Editorial**

Where is TGIC going? This has been a topic at meetings recently, and I would like to give my opinion. First of all, TGIC is a social club. When I come to a TGIC meeting, I know that there will be smiling faces of friends just like me, a transgendered person. I believe that TGIC (and the parent group, TVIC), one of the oldest T\* social clubs in the United States, will remain a dynamic T\* social club into the 21st century, and we look forward to sharing with other T\* social groups and T\* service providers.

A dynamic organization does not remain at rest. I strongly backed the house parties and events out as a way of pushing the boundaries of T\* life beyond our small clubhouse. But, in addition, I share Tina's concern that TGIC not become just a TS and transgenderist club; TGIC's strength has been in its diversity, and we need that to continue. There is a questionnaire about TGIC's program in this issue of the newsletter, page 7; what's your opinion?

I also believe the new political dynamism of some of our members is also a very good thing, because as T\*s come out into life beyond the clubhouse, we need the protection of law and even more than that, the recognition that T\*s are wonderfully unique full-fledged members of a wonderfully diverse society. Like so many social clubs in the past, we have come to a phase of political activism as we take our place in society.

I have a dream for us. I have a dream that some time in the 21st century crossdressed transgendered men will be able to report to work en femme without legal or social stigma. And I have a dream that transsexuals will have their rights easily accessible instead of having to cross the legal quagmire that transition usually requires, and more than that, will be respected by society for what they have accomplished. Until then there is much work to be done....



TGIC provides a safe place to crossdress and express other aspects of feminine behavior, and a place to interact socially with others like us. We can explore the reasons we have for dressing, compare our underlying feelings, see how others have managed these issues, learn techniques for improved presentation as a woman, find out about resources available to us, and, most of all, not feel alone and isolated.

Having the need to dress can be a horrible burden and a dark secret, or it can be an enjoyable activity that, while kept quiet, is in and of itself harmless and fun. Among club members, the desire to dress is assumed and does not need any explanation or excuses. TGIC allows us to openly express ourselves without incurring feelings of shame or guilt. We can discuss fashions, makeup, manicures, shopping, etc., just as any woman would, as well as baseball, biking, golf, hunting, plumbing and other hobbies.

In a legal decision in Great Britain, three TSs who requested sex reassignment will receive that operation from the Health Service. The court ruled they had been denied illegally.

Over 500 individuals are expected to attend Forward Motion: Celebrating Cultures, Advocacy, and FTM Lives, a fall conference for female-to-male transgender people. This conference will be held on October 8 - 10, 1999 in Los Angeles at the Hilton Burbank Airport and Convention Center.

Tracy, self-identifying as a male to female crossdresser., is looking into the possibility of starting an organization type club in the Utica-Rome area that is geared towards Transgender minded people but would like to include both gays, lesbians and free expression type people. The Boy Scouts of America's ban on homosexuals is illegal under New Jersey's anti-discrimination law, the state Supreme Court ruled. The court's ruling is a big defeat for the Boy Scouts, which is fighting numerous court challenges to its exclusion policies. The court, in a unanimous decision, sided with James Dale, a Matawan assistant scoutmaster who was kicked out of the Boy Scouts nine years ago when leaders found out he is gay.

In Thailand, an unwritten tolerance of transvestite students at a major Thai teachers' college appears to signal a shift in government attitude on issues of sexuality. The Bangkok Post reported Friday that male transvestite students on the Suan Dusit campus of Rajabhat Institute are allowed to wear women's school uniforms to classes.

Western movie hero Jeff Chandler concealed a secret behind his manly 6 foot 4-inch tall frame. He was a cross-dresser with a penchant for flowered chiffon and polka dots, according to his former lover, musical swimming star Esther Williams in an excerpt from her autobiography published by Vanity Fair magazine.

[Here's a film about a TS to find. What IS it about Dutchess County and TSs? (I come from Poughkeepsie myself)] 'The Adventures of Sebastian Cole': When a Boy's Stepdad Is the Best Mother of All. Set in 1983 in Dutchess County, New York, the movie gets deeply under the skin of Sebastian (Adrian Grenier), a bright, attractive, energetic high school student who finds out that his stepdad, Hank, is a transsexual.

In England, an ex-policeman who is going through a sex-swap is now planning to marry a man he met on the Internet. Andy Miles, 34, stunned his colleagues in the Metropolitan Police when he "came out" as a transsexual. Now he is divorcing wife Sandra, and is engaged to John Gilmour, a manager for PC World at Chatham, Kent. They plan to marry next year in Amsterdam after the ex-policeman completes his transformation.

A SYMPOSIUM, Friday and Saturday October 22 & 23, 1999. Transgender week will be in October in Provincetown, MA. The week will be a festival of celebration for transgender people and their arts, thoughts, growth processes, talents, and interests. This symposium is intended to be a showcase for the intellectual investigation of the core issue facing transgender theorists: What is gender and how does the understanding of it create and define transgender?

Legendary English outlaw Robin Hood was likely gay, scholars said. After studying 14th-century ballads that are the earliest known >accounts of Hood's deeds, Cardiff University literature professor Stephen Knight said he determined that Hood's true love, Maid Marian, was fabricated by 16th-century authors to heterosexualize the hero who stole from the rich and gave to the poor. His real love was probably Little John, Knight said.

In San Diego, hundreds of gay-pride marchers and spectators were tear-gassed July 24 when someone threw a military-issue tear-gas grenade into the Family Matters contingent during the 25th annual Pride Parade. The 70-person contingent included small children and babies in strollers.

Pfc. Barry Winchell was a model soldier. He was beaten to death July 5 in Kentucky, evidently by members of his own barracks. It now emerges that his involvement with a preop TS may have been the motive for this hate crime. Winchell had been involved in a relationship with a pre-op transsexual named Cal "Calpernia" Addams, who attended this week's hearings dressed as a woman. "When I heard what had happened, I thought, 'Oh God, they've killed him because he was dating me,' "said Addams, a former Navy medic who served in the Persian Gulf War.

In a new movie, "Better Than Chocolate," one of the lesbian characters is transgendered. "Hard centers, soft centers, I like all the chocolates in the box."

In Ottawa, Ontario, Synthia Kavanagh says she's a woman trapped in a man's body - and a woman trapped in a maximum security prison for men. Kavanagh - a transsexual serving a life sentence for the 1987 hammer slaying of a transsexual prostitute in Toronto - has filed a complaint with the Canadian Human Rights Commission alleging discrimination. She wishes to be placed in a women's prison.

[We received the following note from Cheryl. We are following up on contact people and details, but wanted you to be aware of this new and useful support group:]

TRANSGENDER AA GROUP, a new AA group meets at the CDGLCC, 337 Hudson, 8 PM, on Tuesdays.

The "Reverend" Fred Phelps of the infamous Westboro Baptist Church, Topeka, Kansas, is well known nationally for his homophobic and transphobic bigotry and for his mantra, "God hates fags!" Phelps had a very active web site at www.godhatesfags.com, where one could find dozens of hateful documents. photos of Matthew Shepard burning in Hell, and even sound clips of the Phelps preaching against GLBT people, apparently very amused with himself. On August 18, an anonymous good samaritan ended Phelps' presence on the Web by transferring ownership godhatesfags.com domain to the GLBT rival organization, "God Loves Fags," where they can read materials promoting tolerance towards GLBT people.

Intersex in the Age of Ethics, a collection edited by Alice Domurat Dreger, has just been published by University Press Group of Hagerstown Maryland at www.upgbooks.com. "Intersex in the Age of Ethics marks the first time an entire volume has been dedicated to the exploration of the ethics of intersex treatment."

A landmark case was just filed in Minnesota pitting a woman's privacy rights versus the bathroom rights of a transgendered person. Stay tuned!




