PURPOSE:

To have a Convention that is of actual and effective service to the Transvestite/Transsexual Community, and those affected by that Community. It is also intended to provide an educational resource to those persons who may be interested in issues related to Gender Expression and Identity.

OBJECTIVES:

To promote self-validation and self-respect, to develop a sense of togetherness and working together to benefit all, and provide an in-depth educational opportunity for all.

We will achieve our purposes and our objectives by providing a comprehensive program of workshops, seminars, moderated special topic raps, social activities, etc. There will be programs for **crossdressers**, **transsexually inclined persons**, **wives** & **significant others**, **helping professionals** (**therapists**, **educators**, **etc.**), and those members of the general public who wish to learn.

"Last year our objective was to have a convention that would pull us together as a community, give us a chance to tend to business, and an opportunity to reinforce our self-respect. We wanted a chance to learn how to help ourselves, and how to help others. We brought together nearly 150 representatives from 36 organizations and services from the United States and Canada. We talked, shared ideas, and learned from each other. We worked on issues important to our community as a whole, and found solutions to our problems. We emerged with an active Board of Directors working on projects such as a national speakers bureau, and educational publications. We emerged with a convention transcript, a 100-page publication that is bound to be the cornerstone of the future of our community. We emerged with a new spirit of togetherness, and an excitement for our future. Our success exceeded our hopes.

Last year's convention was terrific, but it was also a challenge——a challenge to build on what we've learned. Last year we talked about and found solutions. This year we must do more than talk. We must provide those solutions! We talked about a speakers bureau. Let's build one! We talked about networking. Let's network! We talked about outreach. Let's outreach. We talked (and talked) about the foibles of the helping professional community. Now let's work with the professionals to HELP them do a better job serving us.
