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

Dear Editor:

I received your booklets on "The Art of Female Impersonation" Volumes 3 and 4 and was very pleased with the contents of your publications. I enjoyed looking at the photos of the men dressed in black stockings, lingerie and high-heeled shoes. It made me feel good to know that there are many others like myself who love to dress up in female attire.

As I am writing you this letter, I am attired in a tight slip and dark nylon hose with a garter belt attaching them to my hip length girdle. I am wearing a padded bra with sheer silken panties underneath my girdle. It ook me quite a while before I could obtain the right sizes in female clothes which would conform to my masculine measurements but by a series of trial and error purchases, I was finally able to get the right fit so as not to make it obvious that I was a male in women's clothing.

As I am 5 feet 7 inches tall and weigh 135 pounds, it is not easy to obtain the proper fit in ready made female apparel. By experimenting around, I found that I could wear a girl's size 14 dress when using a size 36 bra. To make my size 28 waistline appear smaller, I wear a




tight belt which constricts my waist in and a full flared skirt to hide my wide 36 inch hips.

My shoe size in male streetwear is a size 7 with a triple "E" width. I discovered that I could squeeze my feet into a pair of girl's springolator style open back shoes size 8 with a "C" width. However, it is most difficult to find the wider width in some women's style shoes. Can your Company advise me of some mail order shoe company who sells women's shoes to men?

I don't mind paying an extra price, just so long as I can obtain several pairs of street wear shoes that can fit my feet properly. When the shoes do not fit properly, it is hard to walk on them and they cause my feet to ache and raise blisters because of improper fit.

I first got started into wearing feminine attire several years ago when the landlord of the rooming house where I boarded decided to have a Halloween party and invited all the roomers to come in masquerade costume. I accepted his invitation but could not afford to rent a costume, so I asked my next door neighbor to loan me one of her dresses so that I could save the cost of renting a costume for the landlord's Halloween affair.





I had always had the desire to wear female clothing and this was a great opportunity for me to do so. At first, Sheila my neighbor was a little reluctant but consented to go along provided that I would buy her a new pair of stockings should I ruin hers. In the privacy of my room I laid out Sheila's feminine outfit and as I dressed up in her clothes, I received such a thrill that I decided to wear feminine clothes every chance I got.

I was very careful to pull on the stockings so as not to cause any runs and also to keep the seams straight. I used cloth padding in the bra at the party but since then I have purchased a set of foam rubber pads. My legs look much slimmer in dark nylons than in any other shade. The darker tones help conceal hair on my legs.

I like the feel of a crinoline slip swirling around my thighs like a lacey cloud. The rustle of the material as I walk is music to my ears. I strut up and down my room in my female outfit after work, as this makes me feel relaxed after a hard day's work in masculine clothing. #### Dear Editor:

As you can tell from your records, I have purchased all of your books on female impersonators and now I have quite an extensive library of books on this fascinating subject. I am submitting some details about myself as well as some photos of myself in female attire.

If you will print one of my pictures in one of your publications, you may have the photos free of charge, as I do not want anything in return as long as you use them in the "Art of Female Impersonation" or any other publications of yours.

As far as I can remember, I have been dressing up in female clothing from the skin out, tracing my desire to the time when as a small boy, I thrilled at the feel of the silk sliding over my skin, when on a sudden impulse I put on a pair of my mother's panties.

It felt so good that I did not want to take them off, but fear of my mother giving me a sound thrashing if she found out made me take off the lingerie. I liked the snug feel of the panties around my waist and the next time my mother was out of the house, I again went into her room and put on her panties.





This time I was not so fortunate, for I neglected to close the door with the lock and before I had time to hide or get away, the door opened and my mother walked into the room. Mother stood looking at me in utter amazement and then exclaimed, "What on earth are you doing in my clothes? Take them off at once!"

"I'm sorry," I replied, making for the stairs, "I'll take them off right away."

"No," mother answered, "you won't get off that easy. You shall have to pay for the pleasure of wearing my clothes," as she grasped me firmly by the ear. "You do look like a girl in my dress, at that, and since the cleaning girl has not shown up for work this morning to clean the house, you can take her place, dressed as you are, to teach you a lesson not to wear my clothes without permission."

Throwing one of her aprons in my face, mother said, "Here put on this apron so as not to ruin my dress and get busy dusting and sweeping out the rooms as part of your punishment." Mother refused to listen to my apologies and pleas that I would never take her things again and so, red-faced, I had to clean up the entire house, dressed all the while in female clothes.



I never forgot my punishment and over the years the desire to be dominated again by my mother or another woman has led me to take up the practice of wearing female clothing. Since black is always a good basic color and does not make one too loud, I use black shades most of the time and vary the costumes I wear with other tones of black accessories.

At home I wriggle into a tight black combination brassiere and panty-girdle and this combination hugs me tight like a second skin. A waist nipper cincher is also worn to compress my waist from a normal 26 inches to several inches narrower. The padding in my bra makes me have a size 38 bust.

My hips are size 38 also, slimmed down somewhat by the panty-girdle, making my waist seem to be 24 inches wide. My stockings are size 10 with black seams, as I do not care for the seamless kind. The seams, when they are perfectly straight and pulled smooth over my legs and attached to the garter attachment on the girdle, make my legs look thinner and dainty. I paint my toenails red and always make sure that the polish is dry before slipping my feet in the sheer nylons to avoid getting snags and runs in them.

My shoe size in men's shoes is size 6 but I wear a 7-1/2 size when wearing narrow closed toe pumps or a size 7 wide width when wearing plastic shoes with open toes or backs. The highest heel I have worn so far in spike heels measured 5 inches in height but I could not walk around in them, which is why I use a normal heel of about 2 inches on my streetwear female shoes.

I have a pair of black cotton gloves which I use when dusting or cleaning but for streetwear I wear a pair of black kid leather shoulder length gloves, which have three buttons in front. I glue false long white fingernails on when not wearing the gloves.

Underneath my black dress I have a slip on, edged with black lace. A pulled in tight leather belt completes my going out outfit. For lounging around in the house, I have a pair of snugfitting slacks with tapered cuffs, which cling to my feet as if I was poured into them.

A knitted wool jersey blouse with short sleeves over my padded bra and a black wig to hide my crew cut haircut and I was transformed into a woman. Next I make up my complexion using a hand mirror so that I can apply the cosmetics properly.



I use pancake base in a darker shade called "Rachel", a slight touch of rouge on each cheek, evebrows darkened, and long length false evelashes well dipped with black mascara. An eyebrow liner is used to bring out the beauty of the eves and lastly my lips are coated with a deep red shade of lipstick, molded into a cupid's bow effect.

I then attach dangling drop earrings to each ear and around my neck I place a five-stranded choker of beads to lend a bit of color to my dark dress. I comb the bangs of the wig down over my forehead to conceal the place where my natural hairline ends. The bangs are trimmed with a scissor in an uneven line to make them appear as if they grew out in that fashion.

A jeweled side comb is sometimes worn to lend color to the otherwise all black wig. The wig is made of real hair and was made up especially for myself by a theatrical costumer. That is why it is quite expensive. If a wig is not made of real hair it becomes obvious to the viewer that it is false and detracts from the effect. If your readers would like to know more of how I changed over from male to female, let me know and I'll recount more of my adventures as a girl. "Belle S."

Dear Editor:



#### Dear Editor:

I want to write to you, telling you how much I enjoyed reading about people who like to dress in women's clothes, as I do. Publishing more of these booklets will greatly help the position of those of us who feel the desire to dress in female clothing. All too often, merely for the sake of sensationalism and to sell newspapers, smear stories are printed of a down grading nature about men in female guise.

I am now 26 years old and I have been wearing female clothing since I was 15. I was first fascinated by high heels and wore them whenever I could. Later, I began dressing in my sister's clothes, girdles, etc. and finally began to use makeup. Of course, I did my dressing up in female clothes on the sly and in private, for I was too shy and bashful to appear in public for fear of being treated with scorn and derision.

I have been married for 6 years and for 4 of those years I dressed in women's clothing without my wife's knowledge. Finally, I told her of my desire for female garments and although shocked and a bit angry, she did not think it was too bad. Gradually she came to accept the idea.



In fact, last Christmas my wife gave me a sweater and skirt outfit and some black pumps, as we do not wear the same sizes. I now dress freely as a woman in her presence and I love her all the more for it.

I have appeared in public now many times in women's clothes and have not been recognized as a man. In fact, I have even been whistled at! As proof of my claim that I have been able to appear in public in woman's attire, I am enclosing several photos of myself taken outdoors.

I am 5 feet ll inches tall and weigh 175 pounds. At home I wear high heels all the time. I recently purchased a pair of shoes with 6 inch heels which I adore. In all, I have 19 pairs of shoes, mostly with two to three inch heels. The wig which I am wearing was purchased last year and it is perfect for me.

I like to wear two-piece outfits of skirt and blouse, so that I can slip in and out of the girls<sup>t</sup> clothes whenever I am in the mood to do so.

I am happy in my double role and have become reconciled to the thought it would be dangerous to submit to an operation to change my sex. Dear Editor:

Ever since I was a young boy, I have been markedly effeminate. This has set me aside from other boys with whom I wanted to play, but was shunted aside because of my girlish inclinations. The idea of an operation is very intriguing to me in my lonely state of mind but I am unable to obtain much informatio about the success or lack of success in this specialized type of operation. My doctor has advised me that an operation of this kind could be extremely dangerous. He told me to consult a psychiatrist before deciding to go through with my plan to change my masculine sex.

My doctor explained to me that after visting the psychiatrist for an extensive period of time, and undergoing therapy, if I still had the intense desire to become a woman, he would do his best to help me out of my plight. He said this decision would be reached only after many examinations and tests to see if an operation would be feasible. If the decision was not what I wanted, I would have to adjust myself to this fact.

I cannot make up my mind what to do, as I realize that this operation is an unpleasant thing to undergo. Yet, it seems to be the way out of my quandary. The countless risks with no guarantee of possible success has made me change my mind many times about the operation, but there are times I would rather die than go through my whole life the way I am at present. Can your readers help me out of my dilemma?




The Editor, Nutrix Co. Dear Sir:


