METAMORPHOSIS MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION

(For Gender-Dysphoric And Genitally-Deficient Men)

After operating METAMORPHOSIS: Gender Counselling--Educational Services as a business concern for one year (1982-1983), its Director, Rupert Raj, has decided to alter its status to a nonprofit corporation and to change its name to the one above. The legal documents for its incorporation have been filed with the Ontario Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations, Toronto, Canada, as of Dec. 6, 1982. The entire process takes 6 to 8 weeks. So, the completed incorporation will be somewhere between Jan. 17 to Jan. 31, 1983.

The Foundation officers are: Rupert Raj, President; Eric Bishop, Secretary; Francis Wong, Treasurer. Several health care professionals have already joined our Board of Advisors. We now need Area Reps.

The Foundation's aims and objectives (in brief) are as follows:

- *Counselling: F-M members, families
- *Education: Professionals, laymen
- *Research: Phalloplasty, Prosthesis
- *Peer-Support: F-M members
- *Support/Co-operation: gender clinics, prof. assoc., TS organs.

Membership is open to pre- and post operative female-to-male transsexuals, genetic males with genital deficiencies, their families, professionals, students, interested others. Membership dues and benefits are listed in the ad on p. 8. Support the Foundation--join today!

MY MASCULINITY

To me, looking upon recognized manhood is like looking upon a valuable prize. To the average male reading this, it would probably seem to him as if I am making a mountain out of a molehill. But that is because when anyone has something--is born with it--is used to it and regards it as common, they take it for granted. The average man takes masculinity for granted. I am a female-to-male man; a transsexual man, and a transsexual man is not an average man. He is exceptional. Extraordinary. (That is the light in which we should see ourselves, instead of as freaks or biological mistakes. Negativity is an evil thing).

Being transsexual for me has been like a prism...there are so many various aspects to live. I am a proud man. But even proud men have been broken and there have been times when I thought I would be. But I believe the true transsexual f-m man will never be completely broken because the goal of living their lives as total men is forever with them, as persistently as the very blood running through their veins...to pursue the physical maleness that matches the mental and emotional is inevitable...is essential.

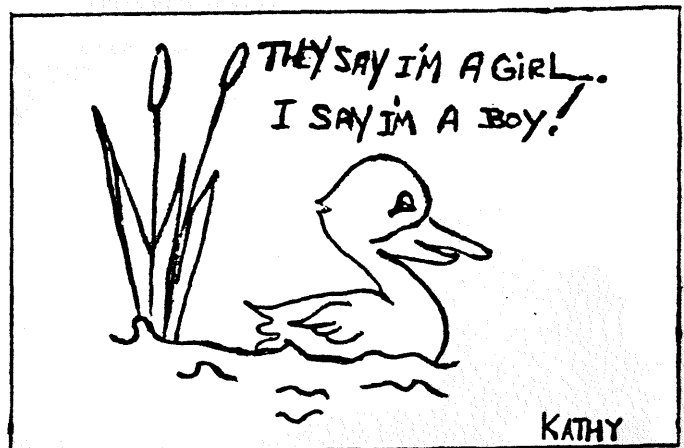
I am unlucky in the aspect that I have a family who is determined to alienate themselves from me (so as to punish me into reverting from my "evil ways" of supposed homosexuality). I personally have nothing against homosexuality--to me, it is yet another way of loving, but I myself, for the most part, am not homosexual. I do not like my circumstances being misconstrued by my family into what it's really not. The fact that they dismiss my need to uncover my masculine self--which hides beneath this camouflage exterior--as an absurdity--ehrases me and saddens me at the same time.

I am lucky in the aspect that I have someone in my life who is behind me a hundred percent. Someone who loves me and shows me--a woman whom, someday, I intend to make my wife. I am also lucky to have beautiful friends who are caring and understanding...people who are like priceless gifts in this unique celebration of life.

I enjoy being a man. It is marvelous. I like working up a sweat--lifting weights, jogging, beating on a punching bag. I enjoy simple pleasures, like shaving, with the soft and lazy sound of jazz in the distance. I like the feel of my brush so close to my scalp while I brush my wavy hair (after so long having to wear "pny tails" as a child!) I enjoy sitting around my home in briefs, a T-shirt and a robe, smoking my pipe and reading GQ or THE TIMES DISPATCH. I like the feel of hard muscle where there used to be soft flesh, and the sight of hair where there once was a bare upper lip...and I like my woman's hands massaging the tension from my back and shoulders. I like talking with the guys about the superbowl and the pool game that was lost yesterday and the car's carburetor, and I like the sound of my masculine voice.

I love the feelings that only a man can have...special feelings of masculinity for an f-m man.

I find it a real comfort to know that a newsletter such as yours exists. Keep up the spirit.

Thank you very much for the information on "passing". It was just what I was looking for. The other articles you enclosed are also greatly appreciated, in particular the article entitled "Information On Transsexualism"*. Although my parents are aware of my feelings and support me a hundred percent in my attempt to have a sex change operation, my brother and sister (and other relatives and friends) are not aware of the problem. My reason for not telling them was simply my ineptness with the English language. You manage to put many of the feelings I would try to express to them in a very succinct fashion. Therefore you've solved one of my greater problems. Thank you very much.

I do have some information on where to purchase men's small/narrow size shoes--any Army Surplus Store or Regular Forces Canex or Clothing Store. They carry men's black dress shoes, work boots, overshoes and overboots. They are good quality, good looking, inexpensive shoes. I have small wide feet (size 5EEE) and found the Canadian Armed Forces the only ones that made shoes that fit. As for shirt sizes, I found although most manufacturers make men's size 13-13½ (neck) few stores stock them; however, Eaton's or Simpson's should order them if so requested (at least on the East Coast).

PASSING IN PUBLIC

(FEMALES-TO-MALES)

- 1) Wear clothing (suits, etc.) tailored to size; don't wear too large a size.
- 2) Don't wear your hair too short (you will look too young) or too long (you will look feminine or gay); comb your hair alongside your ears to resemble sideburns.
- 3) Shave your face daily to induce coarser, thicker beard growth.
- 4) If pre-op (with breasts) wear a home-made breast binder or a man's rib supporter (sold in pharmacies).
- 5) If pre-op (without a penis) wear a padded jock-strap (BULGER UNDERGEAR --see METAMORPHOSIS Vol.1, No.1, P. 6 for ad) or pin a rolled-up sock or a foam rubber neck brace inside your athletic supporter or directly inside your briefs for the male bulge.
- 6) If short, walk tall, hold your head up high and look 'em in the eye; remember: many oriental and occidental men are short; physical stature is not the true measure of a man.
- 7) If your voice is feminine, practice daily speaking and singing into a tape recorder, before a mirror, and listen carefully to the play back, and adjust your voice accordingly.
- 8) Wear a little good-quality jewelry: a gold watch or a diamond stick-pin.
- 9) Don't act "butch", "dykey" or "macho"; don't swagger, spit or swear (at least in mixed company!) Be a gentleman with the ladies and one of the guys with the "boys".

The key to "passing in public" is: think positively, project a confident image of yourself as a man. Think, feel, act, and be the person you know yourself to be--the person you wish the public to see, to acknowledge, and to accept. Don't fret or fuss, just be YOU.

Thank you for your helpful and informative newsletter and your genuine concern as a fellow-sufferer of this affliction.

And, thank you for your prompt reply to my recent letter of request for information on the Urinary Assist Device. I have received the information from Gateway Gender Alliance and have constructed one. I was all prepared for it not to work but it worked great the first time and will be extremely helpful. I thank the Lord for breaking this major (to me anyway) barrier.

As to the success of my phalloplasty, it is pretty much what I expected--a little better than a pair of socks pinned to my shorts. I have to use hair remover to keep the inside free of hair. It is too high and club-shaped so it needs more work which isn't cheap so it will be awhile before I can afford it. I plan to get the testes implant at the same time. With the U.A.D. I probably won't get a urinary hook-up until and if the procedure can be improved. As for sexual intercourse--I haven't had the opportunity and need a stiffening device. Do you know where I can get such a device or instructions to make one?*

By the way, I am a born-again Christian and would like to fellowship with other Christian TSs. Is it possible to have an ad in your next issue? "I will talk to my brothers about God our Father and together we will sing him praises!" (Hebrews2:12).

'HUSBAND' A WOMAN; MARRIAGE ANNULLED, Kitchener-Waterloo Record, 19-79. (Memphis, Tenn.). A 19-year-old F-M husband (on male hormones) was sued by his 17-year-old wife for annulment because she testified that he turned out to be a woman.

SUCCESS CLAIMED IN PENIS SURGERY, source/date unknown. (Los Angeles, CA). Dr. Alexander Vargas, assistant professor of urology at County-USC Medical Center, reattached the severed penis (cut off and flushed down the toilet by the boy's father and later recovered from the sewer, contaminated) of an 8-year-old boy.

NEW FINDINGS ON IMPOTENCE, Times Herald Record, February 16, 1982. (Middletown, NY). A diagram and discussion of the Small-Carrion and the Scott-Bradley inflatable penile prostheses.

HORMONAL DRUG OKAYED FOR INFERTILE MEN, New York Times News Service, February 16, 1982. PERGONAL (hormonal drug, human menopausal gonadotropins) manufactured by Serono Laboratories in Braintree, Mass., is effective in treating men suffering from a pituitary deficiency that prevents them from fathering children.

THE VITTITOW TWINS FACE THE TAUNTS AND TRAUMA OF A SEX CHANGE TO BECOME MALES (MEDICS), People Magazine, May 1982. The life stories of 25-year-old, F-M twins, Marcus and Michael, both nursing home workers.

MAN GIVES BIRTH TO A BABY, National Enquirer, June 29, 1982. The story of Jason Cope, a F-M warehouse worker, who bore his gay male lover (Myles Swain)'s baby daughter before the final procedure in his sex-change made motherhood impossible.

from an 11-year-old Argentine boy (Claudio Aballay)'s abdomen and foot to fashion a new penis to replace the one that was torn away under a truck tire rim. Doctors believe the boy could lead a near-normal sex life but they will not know how much sexual response he will have for 6 to 12 months.

SEX CHANGE COP SUING OVER OUSTER, New York Post, August 28, 1982. (Orlando, Fla.). Scott Brenatelli, a former policewoman who underwent a sex change to become a man, filed a \$100,000 federal discrimination suit against the city of Cocoa, Fla. claiming he was fired after officials learned of the impending surgery.

SEX CHANGE CON MUST STAY IN SLAMMER, Toronto Sun, November 26, 1982. (Miami, Fla.). Robert Meyer, a female prisoner who has undergone partial sex-change surgery has been ordered by U.S. District Judge James Kehoe, to remain at a federal prison in Lexington, Ky., where she contends other female inmates have harrassed her. She was convicted of selling 200,000 methaqualone pills, which, she said, was to help pay for the sex-change operations.

LIVE ON TELEVISION...

JUDE PATTON, Director of RENAISSANCE and his wife, guest-appeared with Dr. Alfred Koonin, a plastic surgeon who performs transsexual surgery, on the program, HUMAN SEXUALITY, on Cable Health Network, on August 18, 1982. Jude related his own life story and answered questions about their sex life--before and after.

RUPERT RAJ, Director of METAMORPHOSIS, guest-appeared with Susan Huxford, Executive Secretary of FACT and Dr. Kenuckchuck, a plastic surgeon who performs phalloplasty, on the program, TEMPO ONTARIO, CKCO-TV, Channel 13, on October 21, 1982. Rupert and Susan spoke about their respective sex reassignments. Viewers telephoned in their questions.
